5.0 WORKSHOP TOPIC

5.1 **Upcoming Federal Election**

The YAC was involved in a consultation process surrounding the Act Local Be Global in Bassendean initiative.

The questions covered connections to different parts of the world and Australia, and then looked more closely at Bassendean to identify some issues around "a more just and sustainable and how we can act local, think global to make a difference".

The session involved using props to identify their travels or migration journeys and also to record peoples' family connections/heritage. Another exercise was called 'Where people sleep' involving collection of photos of children (ages 4-17) from different parts of the world. The purpose was to provide a window onto the experience of young people from different parts of the world as a lead in to thinking about social justice and equality.

The YAC undertook the exercises and associated discussion around their experiences living in the Town of Bassendean in comparison to that of others from both privileged and disadvantaged parts of the world.

Some identified issues experienced living in Bassendean were; house prices, public safety, and petty crime. Some advantages of living in the Town were; convenience, the local people, and childhood experiences in the area.

Feedback regarding the pictures of children from diverse backgrounds generally revolved around a need to assist disadvantaged people around the world and an acknowledgement that Australian lifestyles were lavish with many unnecessary luxuries.
