- Senior—18 years of age or older as at the time of nomination (\$150 cash incentive award and certificate).


Nominations may be made by individuals and/or organisations and are open all year round.

The Town of Bassendean will kick-off its season of summer events with a fantastic music concert on the evening of Saturday 19 November.



prevent mosquito bites at home

Many mosquitoes bite around dusk and dawn, but some can bite day and night. The only way to prevent mosquito-borne disease is to avoid being bitten. Know how to prevent mosquito bites—cover up, repel, clean up.



Cover up

Wear long, loose-fitting, light coloured clothing, covering as much of your body as you can. Mosquitoes can bite through tight clothes like jeans. Make sure children are also appropriately covered up.



Use insect repellent containing DEET (diethyltoluamide) or picaridin and always follow instructions on the label.



Clean up

Stop mosquitoes breeding in water pooling around your home or holiday accommodation by emptying water from containers.



In September 2016, the Town of Bassendean commenced its Mosquito Control and Monitoring Program for this season. The Town receives funding from the Department of Health to reduce ratepayer costs in keeping mosquito numbers down. We work closely with other local governments in the East Swan region and are currently collaborating with the City of Bayswater to treat breeding sites in our area.

The big message at the moment is to control mosquito breeding opportunities whether on residential or council land in order to reduce the risk of contracting mosquito borne diseases, such as Ross River Virus.

Residents and visitors are reminded to take measures to protect themselves by:

- checking front and rear yards for any containers that may be holding water. The mosquito that breeds in buckets and pot-plants can be a transmitter of Ross River Virus and it only needs a few millimetres of water to breed;
- applying personal insect repellent containing DEET or Picaridin if possible;
- reducing outdoor activities during high mosquito activity periods (dawn and dusk);
- covering up by wearing light coloured, long sleeve shirts and long pants that are loose fitting; and
- ensuring fly screens to doors and windows are fitted and maintained.

Are you Fire Season ready?

The Town undertakes annual fire inspections to ensure all properties comply with the *Bush Fires Act 1954* and the Council's Fire Management Practices.

Prior to 31 October 2016, properties of all sizes within the Town of Bassendean shall be cleared of combustible material from the whole of the land. All combustible material is to be slashed or mowed to ensure that it is no longer than 10 cm in height from 31 October 2016 until 31 March 2017.

Living trees, shrubs, plants under cultivation and maintained lawns are excluded from the clearing requirements.

Any variations in the standard of firebreaks are to be the subject of a specific request to the Town's authorised Firebreak Inspector and any such variation shall be for one year only.

The Penalty for failing to comply with the *Bush Fires Act* is a modified penalty of \$250 or a fine of up to \$5000 by the court.

The owner of the property in default is liable whether prosecuted or not, to pay the cost of performing the work directed by the required date.

Please note that the Town of Bassendean's Local Laws prohibit the burning of foliage or bush without the Town's prior consent. If you wish to make enquiries concerning this, please contact the Council's Ranger Service on 9377 7480 for an evaluation of your land.
