



New playground opens in Ashfield

A new playground was officially opened in Ashfield by Mayor John Gangell on Monday 1 May.

The Playground, which is on the Ashfield Reserve between the Ashfield Community Centre and the Ashfield Sports Club, is the first of the district playgrounds to be constructed as part of the Town's *Playspaces Implementation Plan*. The Plan's aim is to rationalise and revitalise the Town's playspaces over the next ten years.

The playground design was finalised after consultation with the local community, and the Town's Disability Access and Inclusion and Children's Services Committees.

As such, the playground incorporates a range of play elements for all ages and abilities, and is the benchmark for future district playground development in the Town.

Local residents and children from the Wind in the Willows Child Care Centre, amongst others, enjoyed free entertainment and a sausage sizzle provided by the Ashfield Community Action Network before assisting the Mayor in cutting the ribbon to open the playground.

Underground power in Ashfield a reality

The State Government has announced that the Town of Bassendean has been successful with its application to convert the existing overhead electricity system to a new underground system in Ashfield. This area will now become one of the 10 projects to be constructed between 2011 and 2014 in Round 5 of the Program.

A survey carried out by the Office of Energy revealed that 72.9% of Ashfield respondents indicated they were in favour of underground power and were prepared to contribute financially.

Western Power has advised that the final costs for property owners will be determined by December 2011 and will take into consideration existing underground power infrastructure and discounts under the *Rates and Deferment Act*.

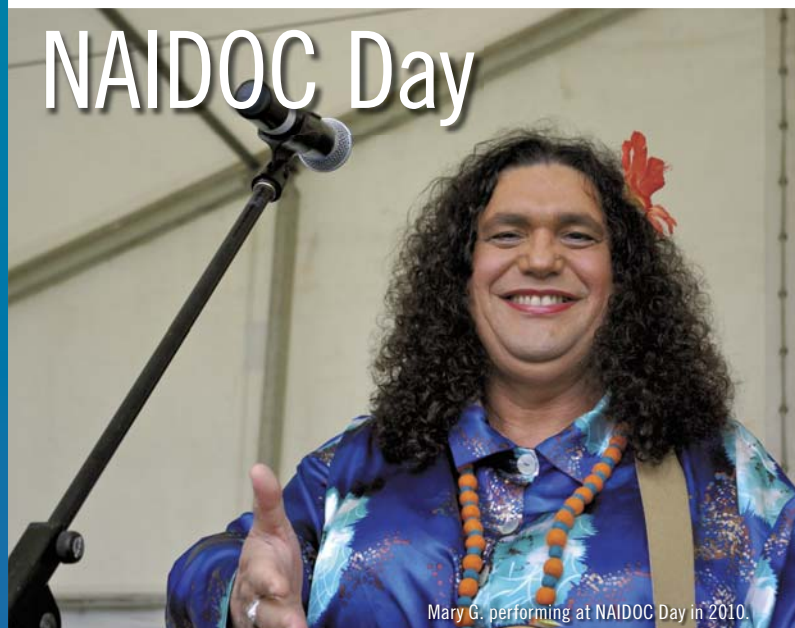
In July 2012, the Town will commence recouping costs for the Ashfield Underground Power project via instalments, subject to a timeframe to be approved by Council. Western Power has indicated that the project is likely to commence in January 2012 and will take approximately 12 months to complete.

The Town looks forward to working with Western Power on the project to convert the Ashfield area to underground power.

Rail Heritage WA is working to build a unique attraction-based facility at their premises located at 136 Railway Parade, Bassendean.

Rail Heritage aims to:

- present an interesting exhibit, attractive to visitors of all ages;
- improve the relatively small number of tourist attractions in the inner eastern suburbs of Perth—some tourists unfortunately see this only as an area to pass through on their way to the hills or to the Swan Valley;
- make maximum feature of an iconic exhibit recently awarded to the Museum by the Commonwealth's Department of Infrastructure and Transport (against strong interstate competition); and
- increase financial viability of the overall Railway Museum.

To assist the group achieve their aims, the Town of Bassendean was pleased to waive the planning and building fees associated with the project, which has saved Rail Heritage WA \$660.

The Rail Heritage Museum is open on Wednesdays from 1.00 pm to 4.00 pm and on Sundays from 1.00 pm to 5.00 pm at 136 Railway Parade, Bassendean.

Bassendean Day lecture

On 12 July 1901, the first meeting of the West Guildford Road Board was held in the billiard room of Cyril Jackson's home, Daylesford.

In 1922, West Guildford changed its name to Bassendean and in the early 1970's became the Town of Bassendean. 110 years on and we are celebrating 'Bassendean' by having the Annual Library History Lecture in the Community Hall at 48 Old Perth Road.

This year, the lecture will feature an address by Mr Paul Bridges on the Pensioner Guard Cottage at 1 Surrey Street, Bassendean. The cottage is a very significant site from a Western Australian historical perspective and of-course for the early West Guildford (Bassendean) historical scene.

To give you a wider perspective of the Pensioner Guard Cottage and a flavour of the era, we will be displaying some of the significant artefacts that were discovered during an archaeological dig on the surrounds of the former Pensioner Guard Cottage.

We are also having members of the Perth Muzzle Loading Club coming in uniform at 6.30pm to show some of the weaponry in use in the 1800s and they will treat us to a volley or two (from the Library car park) to set the evening off.

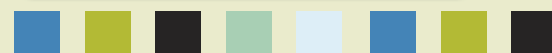
