

Council adopts sustainable budget

At its Ordinary Meeting held on 28 June 2011, Council adopted the 2011/12 Budget.

Council was very mindful of the economic and social environment and has developed a budget that is consistent with its Strategic Plan and at the same time keeping the rates increase to an amount of 3.95% as well as maintaining a level of service that the community expects.

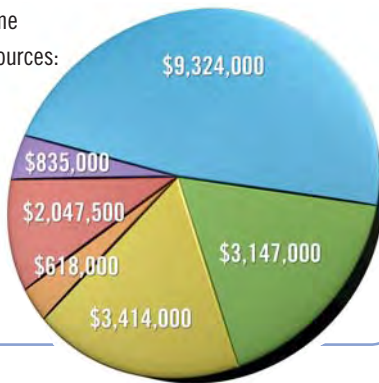
We have a budget of approximately \$19 million and this budget reflects Council's commitment to ensure that we provide a sustainable and viable future for the Town of Bassendean.

For your information, below are the areas of income, expenditure and capital works program that are included in the 2011/12 Budget.

Operating Income

The 2011/12 Budget provides for operating income totalling some \$19.3 million from the following sources:

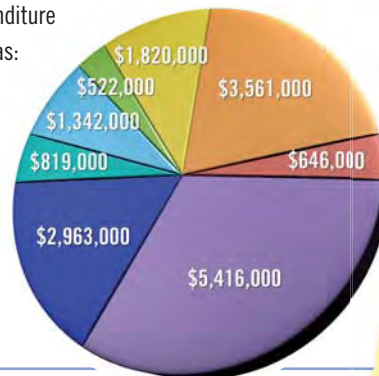

Reserve Funds

The Town's Reserves funds have increased considerably from \$650,000 in 2009/10 year to an estimated closing balance of \$3.9 million in the 2011/12 year. This is mainly attributed to the sale of the Masonic Hall and 85 Old Perth Road.

An allocation of \$2.2 million has been allocated to major capital works projects listed as follows:

The balance of \$1,104,000 will be funded from rates and reserves funds.

Environmental Enhancement

The Town of Bassendean prides itself on the environmental enhancements that have been developed with the assistance of the EMRC and has included projects totalling \$225,000. These include Bushland Management, Cities for Climate Protection, Solar Cities Program, Collective Biodiversity, Water Campaign, Green Fleet and School Education, Future Proofing, and Weed Control.

In addition to the above, Council has received funding for a Flood Inundation Mitigation Plan totalling \$73,000.

Public Events

Public events to be held in the 2011/12 year total some \$250,000 and these include Australia Day, NAIDOC Day, Anzac Day, Seniors' Week, Summer Outdoor Movies, Visual Arts Awards, Avon Descent, and the Bassendean Festival, as well as providing funds for other community events of some \$15,000.

Economic Vitality

Council has allocated a total of \$119,000 for Economic Development. The Old Perth Road Markets will be held again in the 2011/12 financial year. The Markets aim to revitalise the Town Centre and provide a community event that will assist in the development of the 'Bassendean Means Business' approach.

The Town of Bassendean is also a partner in the tourism promotion of the region and contributes some \$11,000 to the EMRC for this purpose.

Conclusion/Summary

The budget is mindful of the increases in State charges which not only affect the Town's operations but also the cost of living for its residents. The budget attempts to reconcile those opposing issues by ensuring that the budget is responsible but attentive to the increasing costs for the community.

There has been an emphasis on the maintenance of vital infrastructure, and also the environmental concerns we all face. The budget looks to consolidating the assets of the Town whilst preparing for a future which may see a changing and drying climate affect the way we do business.

The Town prides itself on being in touch with its community, and the budget makes provision for studies and community consultation on a wide range of projects and activities.

The community will also note that there is a reduced cost in governance for Elected Members, with the Council showing leadership by reducing the number of Councillors to six and abolishing the ward structure. As of October 2011, Councillors will be elected by the whole district and residents are encouraged to participate in the democratic process of choosing your representatives at the Local Government elections in October.



Have you got what it takes to be a councillor?

Local Council elections will be held on Saturday 15 October 2011, so if you have ever considered being a Councillor, now is the time to nominate.

This year's election will be very different from previous ones. All wards in the district of Bassendean have been abolished, and the number of Councillors has been reduced from 9 to 6. These changes mean that there will be no separate ward elections, all six councillor positions will be vacant, and all candidates will face election by the whole Town. The ballot paper will be larger, and electors will need to place a tick alongside each of the six candidates of their choice. Any more than six ticks will be an informal vote.

Are you eligible?

To be eligible to nominate to become a councillor you have to be over 18 years of age and an elector of the Town of Bassendean. This means all persons on the State and Federal Electoral Rolls and those owners and occupiers of property in the Town who are also registered on the Town's electoral roll.

Nominations open on 1 September and close at 4.00 pm on 8 September.

Those wishing to enrol can obtain a nomination form from:

- The Western Australian Electoral Commission;
- Post Offices;
- The electorate offices of Members of Parliament; and
- Offices of the Australian Electoral Commission.

Alternatively, you can download an Electoral Enrolment Form from the State Electoral Commission's website at www.waec.wa.gov.au.

Owners and occupiers of businesses in the Town are eligible to vote and nominate to become a councillor if they enrol through Council to be on the roll. Forms are available from Council's Customer Service Centre or by contacting Ms Jane Goddard on 9377 8007.

Voting system

The voting system will be first past the post and will require electors to place a tick against the candidates of their choice, up to and including the number of vacancies: that is, for Bassendean, a total of 6 ticks.



Interested in finding out more?

If you are considering running for Council, then come along to a 'Regional Forum for Prospective Councillors' to be held on Saturday 20 August 2011 at 2.00 pm at the Midland Town Hall, Great Eastern Highway, Midland.

The forum is free and designed not only for those wishing to nominate as a candidate, but also for those people from within the community who have a keen interest in civic affairs and how local government works from a Councillor's perspective.

Forum topics will include:

- Roles and responsibilities of a Councillor;
- Key competencies required to be a good Councillor;
- Legal constraints upon Councillors;
- Commitment required; and
- How much of your time it will take.

There will be plenty of opportunities to ask questions of a panel of experienced Councillors and Local Government Officers, and representatives from the Western Australian Electoral Commission will be on hand to answer your queries about running for Council.

Drainage program and flood mitigation

The Asset Services' works crew regularly inspects the Town's drainage network and, as a result, compiles a list of works to be undertaken, including cleaning out gullies containing silt and removing debris that may have been washed into the drainage network. These proactive drainage works are undertaken prior to and during the winter months.

As part of this program the Town undertakes four complete road sweeps each year to remove sand and debris from the road and to reduce the opportunity for local flooding and drainage failures.

Checking the network

In addition to the cleaning program, the Town arranges for close circuit television cameras to examine the underground drainage network. This is a great way to see inside the drainage pipes and to plan for future works that may be required.

Budget allocation

As part of the annual drainage improvement program, Council has allocated funds in the 2011/2012 Budget to undertake the following drainage improvement works:

Construct new drainage line connecting Walter Road to Cumberland Way in front of the Ida Street Shopping Centre	19,464

It is intended that residents/business proprietors adjacent to the 2011/2012 proposed drainage improvement works will be advised when the drainage improvements are scheduled to be undertaken.

How you can help

To ensure the efficiency of the drainage system and the quality of the stormwater entering the Swan River, you can help by:

- not sweeping leaves and other debris down stormwater drains, as this can also clog the drains and prevent the free flow of water;
- not pouring anything inappropriate down the stormwater drains, such as cooking fat and oils, as they can block pipes and cause water backup and property damage; and
- keeping building material away from gullies.

For storm or flood damage call the State Emergency Services Assistance on 132 500.

Jubilee path and outdoor gym

The Town is currently in the process of constructing a dual-use path and installing several pieces of outdoor gymnasium equipment at Jubilee Reserve in Eden Hill.

Five exercise stations

The path network includes a new path around the perimeter of the Reserve and five exercise stations strategically placed along the path network.

The exercise stations contain a variety of equipment designed for all abilities, and a range of exercises, and are fully accessible.

Connecting up

The new 720 metres of path connect into the existing footpath network on the southern side, terminating in the vicinity of the Bassendean Caledonian Soccer Club on Northmoor Road. The path also links in well with the path network leading to the Reserve.

The path and the installation of the outdoor gym equipment are scheduled for completion in late August 2011.



Did you know...

How the Memorial Library got its name?

THE BASSENDEAN Memorial Library is so named to commemorate the original location of the Town's War Memorial. The War Memorial was relocated—with community support—to enable the Library to occupy its central site.



The War Memorial in its original site on the corner of Old Perth Road and Wilson Street, opposite the old Post Office.

The Library has been opening its doors since 2 July 1972—a total of 39 years! At 30 June 2011, the Library had a total of 32,895 items for loan plus 38 periodical titles. Not everything is printed material: there are also 4286 DVDs and 1260 music CDs for loan.

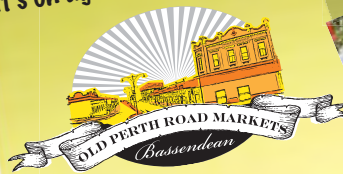
...and how busy our Rangers have been?
