Budget highlights

IN ADOPTING the 2012/13 Budget in June, Council was very mindful of the economic and social environment and has developed a budget that is not only consistent with its Strategic Plan but also keeps the rate increase to 5%. This modest increase will maintain a level of service that the community expects.

In the 2012/13 financial year, the Town will be required to undertake a review of its Strategic Community Plan and funds have been allocated in the budget for this purpose. The results of community consultation will be incorporated in the Corporate Business Plan and this will be used for the development of future budgets. The Integrated Planning Framework, which will take effect on the 1 July 2013, will enable the Town to establish its future direction and ensure its sustainability is maintained for the ensuing years ahead.

Some of the major projects include:

- Continuation of the Success Hill Reserve upgrade—stairs, fishing platform and riverbank revegetation.
- Drainage and reticulation upgrades.
- Energy efficient street lighting for Old Perth Road and West Road.
- · Beautification of the Guildford Road median strip.
- Major events such as NAIDOC Day, Australia Day, Anzac Day and the Art Awards are to continue.
- Mary Crescent Reserve path project.
- New season of Movies by Burswood—December 2012 to March 2013.
- Old Perth Road Markets to continue.
- Review of the Town's Vision 2030 Community Plan.

Integrated Planning—Strategic Community Plan

The Integrated Planning and Reporting Framework (IPRF) was introduced to Local Government in Western Australia in July 2012 as a mechanism to assess the long-term planning and sustainability of each local government for the ensuing 10 years.

The IPRF requires all local governments to adopt the following:

 A 10-year Strategic Community Plan, reviewed every two years.

• A 4-year Corporate Business Plan, reviewed annually. There are a number of informing strategies that will provide the 'level of service and affordability' of the plans. These include:

- Long-term Financial Plan
- Asset Management Plan
- Workforce Plan.

Long-term Financial Plan

Whilst this is an 'informing' strategy to the Corporate Business Plan, it will provide the affordability of the visions and goals of the community and result in the development of the Annual Budget.

Asset Management Plan

This plan will provide the long-term management of existing and future assets of the Town of Bassendean and will also be an informing strategy to the Corporate Business Plan.

Workforce Plan

This plan will provide the current and future human resources requirements to undertake the strategies and will also be an 'informing' strategy to the Corporate Business Plan. In November 2011, the Town endorsed the Vision 2030 Community Plan and this will be reviewed in 2012 to form the basis of the development of the Corporate Business Plan.

In consideration of this resolution, Council was cognizant that considerable cost and energy will be expended by metropolitan local governments in complying with the new legislative requirements whilst being overshadowed by the current Metropolitan Local Government Review. Nevertheless, it is still a requirement for all local governments to continue to pursue the Integrated Planning Framework process, and be compliant by June 2013.

Community Strategic Plan —to be completed by 30 June 2013. Corporate Business Plan —to be completed by 30 June 2013. Informing Strategies —to be completed by 30 June 2013. Fair Value of Plant and Equipment —to be completed by 30 June 2013. Fair Value of all other Assets —to be completed by 30 June 2014.

Is there a tree on your property that you would like to preserve?

UNDER THE Town's *Local Planning Scheme No 10*, Council may make a Tree Preservation Order on trees on private property and the Town would like to hear from property owners who would like to nominate trees growing on their property that might be protected by a tree preservation order.

Tree preservation orders would normally be made because of the tree's aesthetic quality, historical association, rarity or other characteristic that makes the tree worthy of preservation. Once a tree is protected by a tree preservation order, a person may not cut, remove or destroy the tree without the approval of the Council. Tree Preservation Orders are one way that could lead to the preservation of some of the most important tree canopy throughout the Town.

New jetty almost complete

EARLIER this year, work commenced on the Success Hill jetty project which, when completed, will replace the badly worn bitumen paths and steep access stairs and the dilapidated jetty at the Success Hill Reserve in Bassendean.

'The community will be thrilled to see the vast improvement made to the paths, stairs and new floating jetty', said Mayor John Gangell. 'It will make access to this beautiful part of the Swan River so much easier', he said.

The project is progressing well, with all of the civil works scheduled for completion in August 2012. The environment works have commenced and will be progressively implemented over the next 12 months.

This project is jointly funded by the Town of Bassendean and the Swan River Trust.

Old Perth Road and West Road street lighting upgrade

THE MINISTER for Climate Change and Energy Efficiency, the Hon. Greg Combet, recently advised that the Town had successfully obtained an Energy Efficiency Program (CEEP) grant of \$49,962 to assist with the upgrading of the Old Perth Road and West Road street lights.

As a result, Council has included an amount of \$121,924 in the 2012/13 budget which, together with the CEEP funding, will allow the Council-owned and maintained street lights in Old Perth Road and West Road to be changed to LED lighting. This will result in an estimated overall reduction in energy consumption of approximately 7,616 kWh per annum, which is a projected efficiency improvement of 40%. Works are due to be completed by early 2013.

Opening of Guildford Road Principal Shared Path

ON FRIDAY 29 June 2012, the Hon. Donna Faragher MLC, Parliamentary Secretary to the Premier, officially opened the 2.3 km section of the Perth to Midland Principal Shared Path, between the Tonkin Highway and the Bassendean Train Station. After the opening of the new path, Mayor John Gangell said,

'Council has been lobbying previous State Governments for some time to construct this important cycling link and residents will be pleased to see this section completed and I would encourage cyclist to use this safe transport route'.

Construction of the path also includes improvements to the traffic signals at the Moojebing Street intersection, and improvements to the pedestrian crossing and railway crossing at Moojebing Street and Collier Road.

Planting activities for winter 2012

Each year the Town plants a large number of seedlings within the natural bushland areas of the Town to assist with rehabilitation works that are being progressively undertaken.

This year is no exception and the Town is scheduled to plant 10,655 tube stock seedlings and twenty advanced *Eucalyptus rudis* trees.

In accordance with Council's adopted Volunteer Bushcare Guide, the Town has worked with the Bassendean Preservation Group, the Success Hill Action Group and the Town's Bushland Maintenance Contractor to assist with the planting.

The planting process has to be completed within a short period of time in order to take advantage of the winter rains and it is hoped the work will be completed by the end of July 2012.



Looking after the Swan River and foreshore environment

The Town of Bassendean and the Swan River Trust are working together to rehabilitate our river foreshore areas.

People wishing to access the river for fishing, swimming or other activities are encouraged to use existing sand beaches or formalised locations that are easily accessible. The Town has therefore provided six formalised locations, such as the:

- Ashfield Parade Reserve kayak ramp in Ashfield Parade (Moojebing Street end), Ashfield
- Ashfield Parade Reserve 'Roy Hookway Platform' in Ashfield Parade (French Street end), Ashfield
- Sandy Beach Reserve jetty at the end of West Road, Bassendean
- Pickering Park boat ramp in Bassendean Parade, near Watson Street, Bassendean
- Point Reserve jetties located near the intersection of North Road and Surrey Street, Bassendean
- Success Hill Reserve floating fishing platform (scheduled to be completed in August 2012) near the intersection of Success Road and Seventh Avenue, Bassendean.

How you can help care for our river and foreshore

Walking through or standing on foreshore vegetation damages the natural areas, which can then lead to foreshore erosion.

The Keep Australia Beautiful Council of WA recently assisted our foreshore restoration program by installing signs around the Town's most popular fishing spots encouraging good fishing practices to prevent litter and damage to foreshore vegetation.

As a reminder, it is an offence under the *Environmental Protection Act 1986 (WA)* to damage foreshore vegetation or cause harm to the environment. Throwing or dropping litter of any type, even unintentionally, is an offence according to the *Litter Act 1979.*

We all need to be mindful of our actions and take responsibility for the waste that we generate as general debris, such as cigarette butts, plastic bags, rubber, balloons and confectionery wrappers, etc, are frequently ingested and harmful to marine species as they confuse this material for food.

People who are fishing may not be aware that marine debris—such as fishing line, plastic packing straps, twine, cords etc—cause death or damage to marine species by entanglement, strangulation and starvation through internal blockages.



Your report could help

The Keep Australia Beautiful Council encourages people to respect the environment and to not litter. Should you observe someone damaging the environment or littering please take note of:

- the vehicle registration, make, model and colour of the vehicle;
- the date, time and place that the offence was committed;
- the type of environmental damage or litter deposited;
- a description of the offender; and
- whether it was the driver or passenger.

Please report any witnessed incidents to the Town's Rangers on 9377 7480 and they will investigate and take the appropriate action.

Downloadable e-books from your Library

The Bassendean Memorial Library has e-books available for download from the Library website.

Books are available to download for enrolled library members who do not have outstanding books or fines. It is a simple matter of going to the Library website, clicking on the OverDrive to e-books link and follow the instructions.

Up to five titles can be borrowed at a time and the borrower can select a 7, 14 or 21-day loan period for these titles. The e-book expires at the end of the loan period and they cannot be renewed. However, a title can be borrowed again via a new loan.

Currently, only Adult Fiction and Young Adult titles are available. Junior and Non Fiction Titles will be added to the selection in subsequent years.

There are additional new titles added each month by the OverDrive site. Project Gutenberg titles are also available for loan. E-books also can be reserved.

To see what other information is available you can see user guides, tutorials and get help from the OverDrive e-book website and check out the Bassendean Memorial Library website to get started.

E-books from the Digital Media Collection is a state-wide program provided through the State Library of WA and Local Government. This service is also available to any new library members on enrolment.

Who is a Carer?

A carer is a person who provides care and/or support to a person with a disability or who is frail aged. A carer can reside with the people they are caring for or live apart. A carer can be a partner, child, family member or friend.

Who is eligible to be a carer?

A client and/or carers' eligibility is determined at the time of assessment, by a Regional Assessment Service (RAS) Assessor.

Why do Carers need support?

Caring for a person who is frail aged or has a disability can be a demanding role and the carer may need a break to maintain their own wellbeing or need advice and support. Too often the role and the needs of a carer can be overlooked and under-estimated. It is vital for both clients and carers to be supported by a HACC service provider.

Ashfield playground

IN THE early hours of the morning on 10 July, a large portion of the district playground at Ashfield Reserve was destroyed by vandals who set fire to the play structures.

The deliberately lit fire destroyed approximately half of the play structure, about 100m² of softfall and one of the shade sails.

The damage to the playground, which originally cost \$150,000 and was completed in April 2011, is estimated at \$55,000. Council officers are working with the repairers to have the repairs to the playground done as soon as possible.

Red Hill Waste Management Facility proposal available for public comment

A PUBLIC Environmental Review document of the proposed East Metropolitan Regional Council's Resource Recovery Facility at the Red Hill Waste Management Facility is open for comment over an eight-week period.

As part of the Environmental Protection Authority (EPA) requirements to gain environmental approval, the EMRC has prepared this Review to examine the environmental impacts associated with the two technology options being considered for the facility. Key considerations addressed in the document include emissions, odour, noise and human health.

Submissions from government agencies and the public will assist the EPA to prepare an assessment report in which it will make recommendations to government.

The Public Environmental Review document can be viewed online at www.emrc.org.au/per.html or in person at the EPA Library, State Library and at selected local libraries including Bassendean Memorial Library. Hard copies (CD included) of the complete document can be purchased for \$10 (incl. GST, postage and handling) or free of charge, in CD format only, from the EMRC or Red Hill Administration Offices.

What is Household Hazardous Waste?

HOUSEHOLD Hazardous Waste (HHW) comprises the unwanted products used in and around the home that are flammable, toxic, reactive or corrosive. If not disposed of correctly, HHW can harm humans, animals or the environment. These products should not be placed in your household garbage bin otherwise they can end up in landfill which affects the environment.

Hazardous Household Waste is usually found in these places around your home:

- In the bathroom—cleaners (window, shower, tile), disinfectants, hair colours and bleaches, medicines and prescription drugs, pharmaceuticals, nail polish and nail polish remover.
- In the kitchen—drain cleaners, window cleaners, bleach, disinfectants, oven cleaners, metal polish, furniture polish, fire extinguishers, floor care products.
- In the garden—pesticides, fertilisers, fungicide, weed killers, mouse and rat poisons, lawn chemicals, herbicides, insect repellents, insecticides.
- In the garage or workshop—contact cements, thinners, lacquers, paint/ stain strippers/removers, stains, varnishes, roof tar and other waterproofing agents, oil-based paints, chemical strippers, photo chemicals, car waxes, starting fluids, repair products, auto batteries and battery fluid, transmission fluids, rust removers, brake fluid, wood preservative, glue, degreaser, petrol, motor oils, kerosene, lighter fluid, dye, gas cylinders (from BBQs, camping stoves and lamps), pool chemicals, insect repellents and insecticides.
- Around the home—flea collars and sprays, cockroach/flea/fly bombs, petworming tablets, heartworm tablets, mothballs, fluorescent tubes and bulbs, aerosol cans, batteries and chargers.

The Town's residents can take HHW products to be recycled or disposed of safely to the Red Hill Waste Management Facility, 1094 Toodyay Road, Red Hill. Accepted HHW items (combined total of 20 kg or 20 L max, no charge) are:

- Automotive fluids (coolant, brake fluid)
- Poisons

Gas cylinders

Paint/solvents

Flammable liquids
