

Transforming Bassendean's town centre

The Town of Bassendean, together with LandCorp and the Swan Districts Football Club, has agreed to proceed with further developing plans to deliver more residential, commercial and employment opportunities close to existing infrastructure and public transport within the Town with the signing of a Heads of Agreement.

This is an exciting opportunity that has the potential to establish the Bassendean Town Centre as an iconic address, providing options for more people to live and enjoy a lifestyle enhanced by a lively commercial district, with restaurants and cafes within walking distance of the train station.

The proposed Town Centre redevelopment is in its very early stages and State Government approval still needs to be obtained before the planning process is commenced.

To ensure the transformation is a success, once the planning process begins, members of the community will be invited to become involved and have a say in how the development will evolve.

2014/2015 Budget highlights

The 2014/15 Budget provides for one of the largest capital works programs undertaken by the Town in recent years, with \$3,636,404 allocated for works.

The highlights of the program are:

- \$540,000 for local road works.
- \$250,000 for a new toilet block and sports storage facility at Ashfield Reserve.
- \$103,000 for the ongoing footpath renewal program.
- \$214,000 for the ongoing upgrade of drainage.
- \$130,000 for street furniture.
- \$750,000 for civic gardens and war memorial.
- \$50,000 for stage two Gary Blanch Reserve.
- \$88,000 for significant tree plaques and plan.
- \$52,000 for bus shelter program.

A large maintenance program for assets has been included, as well as some new initiatives.

Ashfield Reserve Ablution Block

Work will soon commence on the replacement of the ablution block at Ashfield Reserve.

The new facility will include four unisex toilets and a disabled toilet with baby change facilities. The new ablution block will also include storage space for local community groups and a multi-purpose covered area to one side of the facility. Temporary toilet facilities will be provided throughout the construction period.





Gary Blanch Reserve Redevelopment

Work is well and truly underway at Gary Blanch Reserve.

Stage 1 of the community project is largely completed with only minor works left to complete. The park has undergone a complete facelift with new reticulation, lawn areas installed, hard landscaping and mulching completed ready for planting out of the gardens. Work still to be completed includes the installation of nature playground features and installation of park furniture.

This joint project between members of the AshfieldCAN Committee and Town of Bassendean staff highlights what can be achieved with strong collaboration—and it's not too late to get involved!

Rats — and what you can do about them ...

The Town regularly receives enquiries about rats. The presence and number of rats in an area is determined by the availability of food and shelter. By denying rodents these necessities of life you are able to reduce the rat population in your area.

Around your home you should look at the following:

- Stacking wood off the ground (about 40 cm) and away from sides of sheds and fences.
- Removing fruit and nuts from vines and trees at the end of the season and picking rotten fruit off the ground. Removing fruit from palm trees when in bloom.
- Keeping the backyard and dwelling as clean as possible and free of disused materials.
- Maintaining rubbish and compost bins in good repair with secure lids and free from holes.
- Keeping pet dishes, poultry enclosures and aviaries clean and store bulk pet food in closed containers.
- Regularly removing garden waste from sheds and around yard.

In addition to the above measures owners and occupiers are obliged under Health legislation to take effective measures to eliminate rodents where they exist. These measures usually include a combination of baiting and trapping. Your local supermarkets and hardware stores stock a wide variety of baits and traps.



Public comment invited ...

Strategic Streetscape Street Tree Master Plan and Tree Species Information

The existing and future streetscape of the Town of Bassendean is highly valued by our residents and by visitors to the Town.

A Street Tree Master Plan (including Tree Species Information) was developed to outline specific criteria for tree species selection within the Town and was adopted by Council in December 2009.

The plan has been effective in ensuring that new trees are selected to fit in aesthetically and sustainably with the Town's streetscape and in ensuring that Council consults with the community prior to implementation of any works that will significantly change the existing streetscape. In accordance with Council's policy, the Plan is now due for its five-yearly review and, for a variety of reasons, some of the species listed in the plan are no longer available. We are therefore seeking suggestions from the community for comparable species to include in the Plan.

Work commences on new civic gardens

At its July meeting, Council awarded the tender for the creation of a new civic garden, which will include the Town's War Memorial, on the BIC Reserve at the corner of Guildford Road and Wilson Street, to Building Civil & Landscapes Pty Ltd. The 3D image shown below gives an approximation of what the project will look like when completed in December 2014.

Design elements include the refurbished War Memorial, which will be returned to its original 1923 design, seating, a walk of honour path, lighting and a mix of shrubs and trees. The area will provide a much larger space for the Town's Anzac Day services, and especially in 2015 when it is expected that large numbers of people will turn out for the Anzac Day Centenary Service.

The memorial will be up-lit at night and will provide a wonderful entry statement to the historic shopping precinct in Old Perth Road.

Green waste collections


The 2014 Green Waste collection was a successful project, and great for the environment, as 597.82 tonnes of green waste material was collected and taken to Red Hill Waste Management Centre for recycling.

The 2015 Green Waste collection is scheduled to commence on 4 May 2015. Residential and business property owners within the Town can go to the Town's website and find the actual dates your area is due for collection in 2015—just click on 'Find your bin day'.

How to set out your green waste

To ensure your next green waste collection day is successful, and your green waste is collected in a safe manner, please adhere to the following guidelines:

- Tree prunings and palm fronds are to be **no** longer than 1.5 metres and 200 mm in diameter. (If you engage a tree lopping company please ensure you make them aware of these conditions and you receive acknowledgment in writing from them, as the Town's contractor will not pick up items larger than this size.)
- Small amounts of green waste, leaves, etc, will only be collected in cardboard boxes, **not** in bags or containers.
- Business owners and residents must have their green waste out prior to 7:00 am on the Monday following their set-out weekend. The Town's green waste collection contractor video records all areas due for collection at the time of collection so the Town has a record of what is set out and what is not.
- Green waste will **not** be collected from the Town's parks, reserves or vacant lots, as this is considered illegal dumping and infringements can be imposed.
- Only green waste material listed will be collected—please do not contaminate green waste with any other items such as garden mesh or wire—this cannot be collected as it cannot be recycled.
