





Verge Collections

Maximum of two cubic metres per verge collection (equivalent of two 1.8 x 1.2m trailer loads)



Place your waste on the verge only on the indicated weekend set-out dates.

Rangers will inspect the area to ensure that items are not placed out earlier than the dates below or after the collection dates. Infringements may be imposed.

Pruning or damage to street verge trees is illegal and offenders will be prosecuted.

Tip passes

Each property that pays for a rubbish service in the Town of Bassendean is entitled to four (4) tip passes each financial year.

Attached to the current Rate Notice is the 2017/2018 Rubbish Tip Passes valid until 31 July 2018. These passes entitle the Rate Payer to dispose of waste at Red Hill Waste Management Facility to a maximum of half a tonne (1.8m x 1.2m trailer or utility) per tip pass.

Tip Passes are no longer available from Council Administration Centre or Library. The tip passes are not for resale.

Collections will start at 7:00 am on the Monday following your weekend set-out dates.

Mixed greenwaste verge collection

- » Tree prunings (maximum length 1.5 m x 200 mm diameter)
- » Palm fronds (maximum length 1.5 m x 200 mm diameter)
- » Creepers
- » Tree stumps (maximum length 1.5 m and 200 mm in diameter)
- » Tree leaves (boxed only)
- » Succulents (boxed only)
- » Bamboo
- » Tree prunings with thorns
- » Lawn clippings (boxed only)
- » Vines
- » NO greenwaste in containers or bags other than cardboard boxes
- » NO plastic bags or plastic containers
- » NO branches / stumps exceeding a maximum length 1.5m x 200mm diameter
- » NO junk

- » General junk
- » Stoves
- » White goods (excludes refrigerators and freezers)
- » NO vehicle batteries
- » NO tree prunings and greenwaste
- » NO tyres
- » NO food or household waste
- » NO builders waste
- » NO part of a motor vehicle (except car seats)
- » NO asbestos and material resembling asbestos
- » NO Household Hazardous Waste (take to any Household Hazardous Waste permanent drop-off facility.
 See HHW & DISPOSAL SITES page for locations).

Batteries (household)

Computers and televisions

The National Television and Computer Recycling Scheme is a recycling service for unwanted televisions, computers and computer products (such as keyboards, mouse devices and scanners). Households, small businesses and schools can drop off their unwanted televisions and computers free of charge to Red Hill Waste Management Facility. Items must be "whole". Equipment that has been dismantled for spare parts or valuable commodities and CRT's (screens) out of casing or cracked or broken are not able to be accepted.

Cardboard / packing boxes

Red Hill Waste Management Facility - There will be no charge for residents if cardboard is packed flat and with no foreign matter.

Car parts / bodies and batteries

- Check the Yellow Pages for a local scrap metal dealer.
- Car batteries and other batteries can be taken free of charge to Battery World stores
- Red Hill Waste Management Facility (fees apply).

Fluorescent globes

Drop them off at Council offices, selected libraries and shopping centres. For your nearest drop-off point visit www.rgang.org.au (households only, no businesses).

Medicines / needles / sharps

Take out-of-date or unwanted medicines, needles and sharps to participating local pharmacists to make your home a safer place. Don't put them in your general rubbish or flush them down the drain. Place all needles and sharps in a clearly marked, rigid, sealed

Spectacles and reading glasses

EMRC Waste Education Program

Waste education officers provide free tours for schools and community groups of the Red Hill Waste Management Facility and conduct activities at the Red Hill Environmental Education Centre. Officers also provide free waste education talks, workshops and training courses, and coordinate the school and public place battery and fluorescent light collection programs.

There are a number of hazardous items which must not be placed in your bins. These hazardous items can be taken to any permanent HHW facility, such as the Red Hill Waste Management Facility. It is free of charge to take 20kg / 20L per material type.

No charge for household quantities (no larger than 20kg / 20L per material type). Mixed waste (HHW and / or recyclables with general waste) will incur a fee.
