#### Did you know?

### Natural Reserve Revegetation

During the 2014/2015 financial year, the Town of Bassendean, with help from volunteer bush care groups, planted approximately 15,800 seedlings throughout our natural reserves to rehabilitate the Town's natural areas.

### The Town would like to thank the volunteer bush care groups for their involvement in the annual planting activities.

The Town was also successful in obtaining Swan River Trust grant funding to complete foreshore erosion control works north of the Success Hill Reserve jetty.

In addition to the above projects, the Western Australian Planning Commission and Swan River Trust, with oversight from the Town's Environment Officer, commenced erosion control works at Ashfield Flats Reserve. This work will help to mitigate any further erosion near the boardwalk.

**ALTHOUGH** we have seen the end of summer for another year, the mosquito season has not necessarily ended with it. During winter, the incidence of backyard mosquito breeding increases due to things that we may have lying around the yard which are able to hold rainwater. If the collected water stays stagnant, and the temperature is conducive, mosquitoes can breed in the water. You can prevent mosquitoes from breeding around your home during winter by:

- Identifying and monitoring all stagnant water sources (for example, pot plant holders, birdbaths, etc).
- Checking your garden for containers that could hold water such as jars, bottles, tins, plastic packs, old tyres, pots, etc.
- Removing debris from roof gutters and downpipes.

#### **Responsible dog management**

**THE TOWN'S** Rangers would like to remind dog owners of some responsible dog ownership tips and rules and also to be mindful that whilst you love your four-legged family members dearly, not everyone feels the same way.

When you are walking your dog, please remember that you must have your dog on a leash at all times, unless you are in a designated off-leash area. However, even if you are in an exercise area, there's a few rules we would like to remind you of:

- You must carry a leash with you, capable of restraining and controlling your dog;
- Your dog must be under effective control—if you cannot verbally control your dog, keep it on a leash;
- Your dog must not harass any other users of the area, including people, other dogs and wildlife. This includes your dog running up to and imming on other people or dogs on the mean of the second seco
- jumping on other people or dogs as they may not appreciate it; and
- You must clean up after your dog.

#### **Cat registration**

IN LATE 2013 the *Cat Act* came into effect to ensure responsible pet ownership and to reduce the number of unwanted cats in the community. As a reminder, this means that all cats over the age of 6 months must be microchipped, sterilised and registered with the Local Government where you live. In addition, all registered cats are required to wear a collar and registration tag at all times to ensure your cat is easily identifiable and can be returned if lost.

If you are a resident of the Town of Bassendean and have not registered your cat, or you are aware of stray cats that do not wear a collar and registration tag, please call Rangers on 9377 7480.

#### **Material on verges**

**DID YOU KNOW** that residents and business proprietors:

- are only allowed to place waste, unwanted materials or furniture on the verge in accordance with the annual Green Waste and Bulk Rubbish collection weekend setout dates for your area?
- must obtain a permit to place any type of material or equipment on the verge? If you place waste, materials or furniture on the verge it may attract a \$250 littering fine.

Each property that pays for a rubbish service in the Town of Bassendean is entitled to 4 free tip passes per financial year.

### Tree planting and Adopt-a-tree program

#### **Tree planting**

During the past six months the Town has planted an estimated 300 trees on verges, parks and reserves throughout the Town. More trees will be planted throughout June which will result in more than 850 trees having been planted in the Town over the last two years.

#### Adopt-A-Tree program

Anyone in the Town of Bassendean can register as a tree adopter. Adopters can care for a street tree (or several trees) in one or more ways—for example:

- observing the street tree and reporting any changes;
- removing weeds from around the base of the tree; and
- watering the tree.

It should be noted that residents are not permitted to prune any street trees. If you are concerned about a tree please contact the Town's Parks Supervisor.
