8. This is the oldest red pillar box in Western Australia still in use by Australia Post. Made in 1876, it can be established that it has been at this location since at least 1929.

9. The Pensioner Guard Cottage is the oldest building in the Town of Bassendean, dating back to the 1850s.

Daylesford House (7 Daylesford Road) was built in 1896, especially for Cyril Jackson, the first Director General of Education in Western Australia. Fun fact: Cyril Jackson was the first Chairman of the West Guildford Road Board and early meetings of the road board were held in the billiards room at this property!

12. **Side-quest** Dismount and take a walk into Bindaring Reserve to explore the wetlands. Did you know that Quenda live in this reserve? How many different bird species can you spot?
