



HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE

Please note: The Town of Bassendean greatly values its street verge trees. Pruning, damaging or vandalising a street verge tree is illegal and offenders will be prosecuted




Fridge and Mattress Collection Service

Each tip pass entitles the owner to dispose of up to half a tonne of waste equal to 1.8m x 1.2m trailer or ute.
