STATE CONSULTATION REQUESTS

Review - State Hazard Plan Fire - DFES

The Department of Fire and Emergency (DFES) is progressing a comprehensive review of the State Hazard Plan - Fire. This strategic level plan provides an overview of arrangements for the management of fire emergencies in Western Australia.

For the initial phase of the review, DFES is seeking feedback on the existing <u>State Hazard Plan</u> - <u>Fire</u> from agencies with responsibilities within the Plan, including Local Government.

This initial phase of consultation closed on Friday 31 May 2024.

Feedback received will inform DFES' development of a draft State Hazard Plan - Fire and proposed amendments which will be provided for broad consultation with emergency management stakeholders during June and July 2024.

Review - State Recovery Arrangements in the EM Framework - DFES

As a part of the State Recovery Framework Review, DFES is conducting two focus group sessions with local government representatives to test policy options and obtain preliminary feedback.

The purpose of the review is to better define when and how the state government will provide recovery coordination support to local governments and communities following emergencies. This will include clarifying the role, membership, responsibilities and accountability of key state level recovery coordination positions and groups and the DFES Resilience and Recovery Portfolio.

State Support Plan - Animal Welfare in Emergencies

WA Emergency Management Sector Adaptation Plan Discussion Paper

The State Emergency Management Committee (SEMC) is developing the Emergency Management Sector Adaptation Plan (EM-SAP) to support Local Governments advance climate change adaptation and emergency management goals together.

WALGA coordinated a targeted consultation with Local Governments to inform this pivotal SEMC initiative. WALGA held an **EM-SAP Information Webinar on 14 February** and **Interactive Workshops for Local Governments on 20, 21 and 26 February** to collaboratively explore the questions posed in the EM-SAP Discussion Paper.

Broader community consultation on the discussion paper has now closed with the delivery of the final EM SAP expected in mid-2024

STATE ADVICE

Amendments to State Emergency Management documents


On 8 May 2024, the SEMC approved the comprehensive review of the State Hazard Plan - HAZMAT which provides an overview of arrangements for HAZMAT emergencies in Western Australia.

The comprehensive review was completed by the Department of Fire and Emergency Services, distributed for broad consultation between 17 November 2023 and 12 January 2024 and endorsed by the Response Policy Subcommittee prior to submission to SEMC for approval.

The comprehensive review process identified support for:

- Removal of the term 'hazardous materials' from the title of the State Hazard Plan to reduce the confusion between the definition of a 'hazardous substance' within the *Emergency Management Act 2005* and the definition of 'hazardous materials' in the *Fire Brigades Act 1942*, and the *Fire and Emergency Services Act 1988*.
- Removal of a chemical, biological and radiation (CBR) emergency arrangements. The former plan described a CBR emergency as a 'hostile act or event, the intention of which is to kill, maim, sicken or prevent society from continuing with normal daily business'. Consequentially, CBR emergency arrangements were incorporated into State Hazard Plan Hostile Act and State Hazard Plan Terrorist Act (Sensitive).
- Inclusion of roles and responsibilities across prevention, preparedness, response and recovery included into Appendix C.
- Accessible redesign and statement of fact updates.

The new State Hazard Plan- HAZMAT and State Hazard Plan - Hostile Act can be viewed via the <u>SEMC website</u> as well as a <u>detailed summary of amendments</u>.





Local Emergency Management Committee Handbook and useful tools

The LEMC handbook provides local governments with a summary of the actions and best practice principles as required under section 38 – 40 of the *Emergency Management Act* 2005, State Emergency Management Policy, procedures, and guidelines.

The LEMC Handbook provides a summary of the WA emergency management arrangements, key roles, and responsibilities and best practice advice for the administration of LEMC.

The Handbook also includes sample LEMC Terms of Reference and Meeting Agenda templates, which can be downloaded from the SEMC website.

Disaster Recovery Funding Arrangements Western Australia (DRFAWA)

Natural disasters or terrorist acts can result in large-scale expenditure in the form of emergency and recovery assistance. To assist with this financial burden, the Australian and Western Australian governments have joint arrangements in place to provide financial assistance in certain circumstances. These arrangements are referred to as the Disaster Recovery Funding Arrangements Western Australia (DRFAWA) and are administered by the Department of Fire and Emergency Services (DFES) on behalf of the WA State Government.

The Disaster Recovery Funding team, a part of State Recovery, has developed a suite of Factsheets to assist with understanding what is required to be eligible for Disaster Recovery Funding WA (DRFAWA).

Basic criteria are outlined below and if any LG's are interested in having the Disaster Recovery Funding team provide a presentation on how they can help with post incident recovery and the recovery funding mechanisms please let me know and I will put you in touch.

For assistance to be made available under the DRFAWA, the event must meet all three of the following criteria:

- 1. The event was one or a combination of the ten specified disasters including bushfire, earthquake, flood, storm, cyclone, storm surge, landslide, tsunami, meteorite strike, tornado; or the event was a terrorist act.
- 2. A coordinated, multi-agency response was required.
- 3. Eligible expenditure relating to emergency assistance, damage to essential public assets and/or other eligible assistance provided in relation to the event exceeds \$240,000 across the affected local government areas.

GRANT PROGRAM UPDATES

The National Disaster Risk Reduction (NDRR) grant program

The National Disaster Risk Reduction (NDRR) grant program is established under a National Partnership Agreement (NPA) on Disaster Risk Reduction (2019-2024). It seeks to proactively reduce the risk and limit the impact of disasters associated with natural hazards on Western Australian communities and economies.

Apply for a National Disaster Risk Reduction grant (www.wa.gov.au)

All-West Australians Reducing Emergencies (AWARE) grant program.

The 2024-25 round of the AWARE grants will <u>open</u> on Monday 20 May 2024 at 8 am and close to 12 pm noon, Monday 1 July 2024.

Funding:

- The 2024 round has a total allocation of \$200,000.
- Projects could apply for between \$2,500 \$35,000 (no GST applied), including local level risk assessment projects.
- Applicants must contribute at least 25 percent of the total project cost in cash and/ or in-kind.

Eligible project types:

- Furthering the emergency risk management process
- Facilitating capability-based exercises
- Assistance in reviewing Local Emergency Management Arrangements (LEMA)
- Delivering emergency management training, events, or forums

How to apply:

- All applications must be submitted through the <u>online portal</u> available on the <u>SEMC</u>
 <u>Website</u>. Applications received through any other channels such as emails or
 post will not be accepted.
