Don Yates 10 Thompson Road Success Hill

- Provided historical account of his family's connection to area
- The Association between Success Hill and Guildford goes back a substantial period of time
- The Town of Bassendean is small however it does have approx. \$25m land assets
- Understands Guildford's desire to restore their historical sites before the 200th year of white settlement which is only five years away
- State and Federal Government could be contributors towards those historical sites and events leading up to that celebration
- Wouldn't mind Bassendean donating to this however not as a potential cash cow to support other causes
- Wish Swan well however Bassendean should look North to Reid Highway or West to Tonkin Highway would be more suitable

Hilary McWilliam 20 Elder Parade Bassendean

This request is simply for the Town of Bassendean to engage with the City of Swan to discuss potential realignment of the local government boundary and has been prompted by a Motion presented by ratepayers at the February City of Swan Annual Meeting of Electors.

In that Motion, supported by Swan ratepayers, a desire was expressed to address the needs of communities more closely aligned to the Town of Bassendean, geographically and historically, that have similar demographics, urban density and activity.

The factors outlined by the Local Government Advisory Board to evaluate proposals for changes to local government boundaries include the following:



- community of interest
- physical and topographical features
- demographic trends
- economic factors
- the history of the area
- transport and communication
- matters affecting the viability of the local government
- the effective delivery of government services

Logic dictates that adjoining local governments collaborate to review district boundaries to ascertain what synergies may exist to unite communities of interest. To highlight a prime example, it would appear that Guildford, Woodbridge and Kiara have significant connections and similarities to Success Hill, Eden Hill and Bassendean. Councils should always strive for the efficient delivery of targeted services, and a collaborative review may highlight some suburban areas more closely aligned to the Town of Bassendean locality than the City of Swan.

Clearly detailed analysis is undertaken to determine the potential for any boundary realignment culminating in the Local Government Advisory Board engaging in targeted consultation with those urban communities that may (or may not) support inclusion and representation by the Town of Bassendean.
