10 years old! Library celebrates another birthday!



Dog and cat registrations

It's that time of year again when dog and cat registrations that expire in 2015 are due to be renewed.

For dogs there has been a change to the *Dog Act* which comes into effect on 1 November 2015. All dogs over the age of 3 months must now be microchipped as well as being registered.

For cats, all cats over the age of 6 months must be microchipped, sterilised and registered.

Microchipping is simple procedure where a small chip is injected under the skin of your animal, usually on the back of their neck by a needle, much like their annual vaccinations.

Dogs and cats can only be certified as exempt from microchipping, or cats exempt from sterilisation, if a veterinarian provides you with a certificate stating that it would be injurious to the health of your animal to microchip or sterilise it.

Please note that there are \$200

infringements associated with failing to ensure your dog or cat complies with each of the above requirements, so please, avoid these penalties and get your dogs and cats microchipped and registered and your cats sterilised.

Bulk Rubbish Collection 2015

The 2015 Bulk Rubbish Collection is scheduled to commence in late October and be completed by early December 2015.

An information flyer will shortly be delivered to each residential and business premises within the Town specifying individual weekend set-out dates. Additional information regarding waste and recycling is also available within the Town's website under Quick Links: www.bassendean.wa.gov.au/.

As a resident or business proprietor you are only permitted to place household furniture, whitegoods, metal products (stoves, washing machines and air conditioners), timber products (maximum size 1500x900x700mm) and general junk (maximum size 1500x900x700mm) on your street verge.

Refrigerators and freezers will not be collected as a collection service for these items can be arranged by calling 9377 8000.

If you wish to place bulk rubbish, greenwaste, unwanted materials or furniture on the verge outside of the annual collection weekend set-out dates, please don't, because unauthorised materials may attract a \$250 Littering Fine.

If the annual collection weekends set out dates do not suit you for the disposal of unwanted material, for your convenience 4 tip passes have been attached to this year's rates notice.

Fire Season Notice to all land owners and occupiers

Fire break notice

Bushfires act 1954

THE Town undertakes annual fire inspections to ensure all properties comply with the *Bushfires Act 1954* and the Council's Fire Management Practices. Prior to 31 October every year, properties of all sizes within the Town of Bassendean shall be cleared of combustible material from the whole of the land. All combustible material is to be slashed or mowed to ensure that it is no longer than 10 cm in height from 31 October until 31 March the following year.

Living trees, shrubs, plants under cultivation and maintained lawns are excluded from the clearing requirements.

Any variations in the standard of firebreaks are to be the subject of a specific request to the Town's authorised Firebreak Inspector and any such variation shall be for one year only.

The Penalty for failing to comply with the *Bushfires Act* is a modified penalty of \$250 or a fine of up to \$5000 by the court.

The owner of the property in default is liable whether prosecuted or not, to pay the cost of performing the work directed by the required date.

Please note that the Town of Bassendean's Local Laws prohibit the burning of foliage or bush without the Town's prior consent. If you wish to make enquiries concerning this, please contact the Council's Ranger Service on 9377 7480 for an evaluation of your land.

Protect your family: A hot dry summer ahead means fires!

THE Bureau of Meteorology is predicting an above average hot, dry summer this year – and that means the Department for Fire and Emergency Services (DFES) will be busy!

"Yes, the Town of Bassendean is largely urban, but the risk of loss to life and property by fire in our community remains high" said Mayor John Gangell. "Last summer in two separate fire events in Ashfield, families from our community lost their homes and all their possessions. And let's not forget that Ashfield Flats went up in January this year with several adjoining Hardy Road properties sustaining some damage," he added.

"It's frightening just how quickly a house fire grows. In December last year, as I stood and watched, the Collins' family home become totally engulfed in flames in a matter of minutes," said Graeme Haggart, the Town's Director Community Development and Local Recovery Coordinator. As tragic as it was for the family and their friends, it was fortunate that no other homes were lost.

"Really, we were very lucky. Embers from that fire fell onto properties over a wide area and are known to have burnt holes in shade cloth up to a block away. It could have been so much worse," added Mr Haggart.

One lesson taken from these events is that complacency is not an option.
