After almost six years of uncertainty, caused by the local government reform process, it is with great pleasure that I advise that our wonderful Town of Bassendean is here to stay.

After the amalgamation polls in East Fremantle, Kwinana and South Perth failed, the State Government abandoned the remaining forced boundary mergers of which the Town of Bassendean was one. This is a great outcome for the Town of Bassendean as we were assessed under the State Government's own criteria as being self-sustainable into the future.

A big thank you to our community for being so supportive of ensuring we retained our Town. Also thank you to the staff, and particularly the CEO, Mr Bob Jarvis, for the considerable amount of work that he has put into the process over the past six years, and the Councillors who have been determined to stand up for our community and our Town.

Our community spirit has prevailed and well may we say, "Long live the Town of Bassendean".

Lotterywest funding for **Civic Gardens** LOTTERYWEST has provided a grant of \$175,000 towards the cost of establishing the Civic Gardens at the BIC Reserve as part of the joint relocation of the Bassendean war memorial and civic gardens project.

Mayor John Gangell said, "This generous grant from Lotterywest for the Civic Gardens is a fantastic result for our community and will ensure that the Bassendean War Memorial will be in a setting that provides a fitting tribute to those who have paid the ultimate price for the freedom we enjoy today."

Grants received for the civic gardens and war memorial projects from Lotterywest, the Australian Government under the Anzac Centenary Local Grants and the 'Saluting their Service' Commemorative Programs total over \$215.000.

The Bassendean War Memorial, in its new garden setting on the BIC Reserve, will be officially dedicated at a ceremony to be held on Saturday 11 April at 10.30 am. Residents are welcome to attend.

Municipal Heritage Inventory Review

THE TOWN of Bassendean has commenced a review of the Municipal Heritage Inventory (MHI) which was adopted in 2005. This review is a requirement under the *Heritage of Western Australia Act 1990*.

The Municipal Heritage Inventory is a list of places that have cultural heritage significance because they are places that are evidence of Bassendean's history. Bassendean has a rich and diverse history that is unique in Western Australia and the Town of Bassendean is committed to

preserving this heritage for future generations. Reviewing the current Municipal Heritage Inventory will involve assessing each place that is currently on the MHI as well as assessing new places for possible inclusion on the MHI. An important part of the review is exploring strategies to provide certainty for landowners and the community in the planning processes for heritage identification, conservation and protection.

Anyone can nominate a place and community involvement is essential to make this review a success.

Poppy power: a community tribute of respect and remembrance

LOCALS of all ages have been busy knitting, crocheting and sewing poppies as part of the nationwide community arts project '5000 Poppies' to commemorate the ANZAC Centenary.

RESERVE

A field of more than 120,000 poppies will be planted in Federation Square, Melbourne as a stunning visual tribute to Australian Servicemen and Servicewomen to commemorate more than a century of service in all wars, conflicts and peacekeeping operations.

Locally made poppies will join the display in Melbourne as well as being displayed at the Town's ANZAC Day service.

Workshops have been running over the past month in cafes around the Town, with the final 'Poppy Making Meet Up' set for Wednesday 25 March from 10.00–11.30am at Hedgehogs Café in Old Perth Road.

Collection points for completed poppies are located at the Town's Customer Service Centre, the Bassendean Memorial Library, and The Tasty Pear at the Shopping Centre.

Burglar Awareness!



IN RECENT WEEKS there has been a spike in burglaries and theft from motor vehicles in Bassendean with many being attributed to complacency from residents regarding security.

While most burglaries are opportunistic, it's too easy for thieves to target houses where residents leave doors and windows unlocked, especially during the day—and while they are at home in a number of cases. In one incident a resident left her handbag, which also contained her house keys, in her unlocked vehicle thus allowing the burglar to enter with ease. Here are some simple habits to improve your safety and reduce the risk of becoming a victim:

- At night, closing your curtains will stop burglars seeing who is at home and what valuables are inside. Make sure handbags or wallets are not left in sight on bench tops or cupboards.
- Keep security doors locked when any doors are open—even when you are at home and also when you are expecting visitors. If you are working in the garden, lock all your doors and windows and carry the key with you.
- Trim any bushes or shrubs, that grow above window height to give a clear view to your house and not provide a hiding place for burglars.
- Remove all valuables such as wallets, laptops, iPads, briefcases and GPS's from your car each night before you lock it.

Additionally, if you see anything which looks suspicious report it to the Police on 131 444 or to Crime Stoppers on 1800 333 000. All calls are treated with confidentiality and callers can remain anonymous.
