Mosquitoes—our control program

The Town's Mosquito Monitoring and Control Program focuses on the breeding of mosquitoes in wetland areas adjacent to the Swan River. Approximately 95% of the mosquito problems experienced in the Town are associated with these areas.

Wetlands are low-lying areas saturated with water for long enough periods to support vegetation. Wetlands are important as they help improve water quality and regulate nutrient flow. However it is important to recognise that this environment also provides mosquitoes with ideal breeding conditions. Many of these breeding sites are very close to residential areas and therefore may impact significantly on the health and lifestyle of residents and visitors to the Town.

The program

The Town's program commences at the beginning of the mosquitobreeding season, usually around September, and concludes at the end of the season, approximately in May each year. The program involves:

- inspections of sites two to three times a week during breeding
- treating the sites when breeding is found with approved
- · regular trapping of adult mosquitoes to identify species and populations;
- treatment of mosquito breeding on public land;
- enforcement of local laws in relation to breeding on private property;
- investigation of complaints regarding excessive breeding;
- inspecting stormwater drains when required;
- follow-up questionnaires with residents who contract a mosquitoborne disease:
- health promotion activities; and
- regular meetings with neighbouring local authorities, (the Cities of Swan, Bayswater and Belmont and Department of Health), to exchange information, compare results and ensure a co-ordinated and consistent control program.

Take precautions

It is important to recognise that despite there being a mosquito management program in place, and the fact that total eradication is not possible as mosquitoes are a part of our natural environment, those who reside near or frequently visit the wetland areas must take their own protective measures to avoid being bitten.

The essential measures that should taken to reduce the risk of being bitten and minimise contracting a mosquito borne disease are:

- reduce outdoor activities during high mosquito activity periods (dawn and dusk);
- cover up by wearing light-coloured, long-sleeved shirts and long pants that are loose fitting;
- apply personal insect repellent containing DEET or Picaridin if possible:
- ensure fly screens to doors and windows are fitted and maintained; and
- check your property for potential breeding sources.

Around the home

Mosquitoes breed in standing water! It is therefore important to ensure that your property is also free from mosquito breeding. To prevent them breeding in your backyard:

- get rid of containers that hold water;
- keep mosquito-eating fish, like goldfish, in garden ponds and eliminate vegetation around the edges of the pond;
- keep swimming pools well chlorinated, filtered and free of dead
- fit rainwater tanks with insect-proof mesh, including inlet, overflow inspection ports;
- · ensure your guttering is water-free; and
- empty pot plant drip trays once a week or fill them with sand.

There are a variety of products that can assist in reducing mosquito numbers around your property that can be applied to vegetation and surfaces.

Graffiti Force will remove graffiti from:

- Council owned assets including but not limited to office buildings, public halls and facilities, public toilets, aged accommodation, signage, playground equipment, reticulation control boxes, bus shelters, fencelines and walls, streetlights, entry statements, and parks and street furniture.
- Public or private service provider assets, such as (Telstra, Alinta Gas, Water Corporation, Western Power, Public Transport Authority, MRWA etc) that either abut or are wholly located on Council owned land. These include but are not limited to light and power poles, signage, control boxes, fence lines and walls and bus stop indicator poles.

Ashfield Underground Power project

THE TOWN is pleased to advise that the works to underground the power supply in Ashfield are scheduled to commence in the first quarter of 2012. Western Power has advised that the Ashfield Underground Power design is near completion and final approvals are being obtained. It is anticipated that a project start up newsletter will be sent to all property owners shortly before the project commences which will have details of the different aspects of the work to be done and a map showing the flow of work through the area.

In December 2011, the Council will consider the term and the method of recouping the underground power costs and it is planned that the first instalment of the underground power costs will be listed in the 2012/13 rate notices.

Mary Crescent Reserve —Gathering Site

IN 2005, Council approved the Mary Crescent Reserve Concept Plan and since then has been progressively implementing the plan by removing the old dilapidated public toilets, undertaking the renovation of the existing Alf Faulkner Hall—including a new roof—and by constructing new public toilets.

Recently, the Town was successful in obtaining grant funding from the Federal Government's Regional and Local Community Infrastructure Round 3 to construct the Mary Crescent Reserve Gathering Site. As a result, the Town engaged Mr Peter Farmer to prepare detailed drawings and to construct the gathering site.

The gathering site construction phase is due to commence shortly in the approximate location shown on the Concept Plan, which is towards the north-east side of the reserve.



THE TOWN of Bassendean is seeking public comment for the proposed naming of the fishing/viewing platform at the bottom of the French Street steps in Ashfield, in recognition of local Ashfield resident, the late Mr Roy Hookway, who passed away on 14 August, aged 85.

Mr Hookway was a well-known local and one of our longest serving residents of Ashfield having purchased a block in Ashfield Parade in 1953 for £250. He made a significant contribution to the development of Ashfield. In his later years Roy was a familiar face walking his dog down along the river where he would always have time for a chat.


The AshfieldCAN raised the request and Council has approved in principle the platform being named the 'Roy Hookway Platform' and is seeking public comment on the proposal. A report will be referred to Council at the conclusion of the comment period for a final determination.

Landgate has confirmed the fishing platform has no registered name at present, and supports it being named to assist emergency services attending to any call outs.



Dogs: is yours a nuisance?

IS YOUR DOG being a nuisance and you don't realise it? We all like to have our four-legged best friends with us whenever we can but did you know that your dog jumping up on someone or rushing up to them can be considered a nuisance under the *Dog Act*? In some cases this can even be considered a dog attack and result in infringements or prosecution?

When out with your dog remember that unless you are on private property or in a designated dog off-leash area, your dog must always be on a lead and under effective control at all times. Even when in a dog exercise area you must have a collar on your dog and you must have a suitable leash with you. Your dog must be under your control and not be allowed to harass other users or animals in the area.

When off the lead, effective control includes, but is not limited to, the dog immediately responding to and obeying a command to return to you, or the dog is kept within easy reach for you to grab hold of its collar to physically control or restrain the dog.

Cats: Responsible Cat Ownership laws passed

LOCAL GOVERNMENTS will soon be empowered to reduce the large number of stray cats being euthanased each year and promote responsible cat ownership in their communities to reduce the unwanted impacts of cats on the community and the environment.

The *Cat Act 2011* came into force on 9 November 2011 and will come into operation over two phases. The first phase will commence on 1 November 2012 to give local governments the opportunity to put the necessary administration into place.

Phase two will begin from 1 November 2013, when all cats that have reached 6 months of age will need to be microchipped, sterilised and registered with the local government where they are usually kept; and prior to the transfer or sale, all cats must be microchipped and sterilised.

The *Cat Act* will give local governments the power to deal with owners that are not responsible, including cat hoarders, and with cats that are not owned. In addition, local governments will be able to create local laws for the control of cats within their district.

The Department of Local Government will also be developing regulations to support the legislation in relation to registration tags and some fees and charges payable under the legislation. The local government sector, along with other stakeholders, will be consulted during the development of the regulations.



Wildlife: who do you call?

AS WE ARE nearing summer there may be times when native animals in the area are increasing their activity, particularly snakes.

When dealing with any wildlife, be that injured, orphaned or just a nuisance, the people to call are the Wildcare Helpline on 9474 9055.

This service is run by the Department of Environment and Conservation and they operate 7 days a week, 24 hours a day. They are a telephone referral service and they can put you in touch with the most appropriate person or organisation to help you and our native wildlife.
