Community input is sought into a review of the Town of Bassendean Playspaces Implementation Plan.

The Plan was adopted in 2009 with the purpose to provide guidance for the provision of playspaces and the associated infrastructure on public open space within the Town. The Plan had a number of short and long-term objectives on the provision, upgrade and/or relocation of play structures. The recently opened district playspace at Ashfield was achieved as part of this Plan.

The Town of Bassendean, in conjunction with its Children & Family Services Committee, is planning a review of the Playspaces Implementation Plan and is seeking community input into the Terms of Reference for the review, so a community workshop will be held (details below).

Local Government elections will be held on Saturday
15 October. This year's election will be very different from
previous ones, as all wards have been abolished and the
number of councillors has been reduced from nine to six.
These changes mean that all councillor positions will be
vacant, and all candidates will face election by the whole Town.

The ballot paper will be larger, and electors will need to place a tick alongside each of the candidates of their choice, up to a maximum of six. Any more than six ticks will be an informal vote.

Below are a number of frequently asked questions from the Western Australian Electoral Commission's website.

Q: Do I have to vote? If I don't vote will I get fined?

- A: You are encouraged to vote, however it is not compulsory to do so in a Local Government election.
- Q: I own more than one property in the Town. Why do I only get one vote?
- A: You will only get one vote, irrespective of how many properties you own in the Town, as all wards have been abolished.
- Q: I want to vote on election day. Can I do this?
- A: This is not a voting in-person election. The election is being conducted by post. You can however, take your completed package to the local government office on election day and hand it to the Returning Officer or polling staff. Replacement packages are also available if you have mislaid or spoilt the one sent out.
- Q: How can I be sure that my vote is secret?
- A: No-one will know how you have voted. The Commission will mark you off the roll when your package is returned. The flap that you sign on the declaration is then removed from the ballot paper envelope. The ballot paper envelope is processed. The ballot paper is placed into a sealed ballot box. That box is not opened until 6.00pm on election day.
- Q: When will the ballot papers be counted?
- A: Counting will start at 6.00 pm on Saturday 15 October 2011 at the local government office.
- Q: I've made a mistake on the ballot paper. How do I correct it?
- A: You can cross out your mistake and mark the ballot paper correctly. Alternatively, you can go into your local government office and ask for another ballot paper.
- Q: Can I use pen or pencil to mark the ballot paper?
- A: You can use either.
- Q: How do I mark the ballot paper?
- A: You will need to place a tick alongside each of the candidates of your choice, up to a maximum of six.
- Q: When will I receive my package?
- A: Packages will be delivered from Wednesday 21 September 2011.
- Q: I have not received a package.
- A: Please wait until Wednesday 28 September and if you have not

received a package by then, contact your local government office who can provide you with a replacement package.

- Q: Can I take my package to the local government office instead of posting it?
- A: Yes, you can drop in your package at your local government office during office hours. You can do this up to and including Saturday 15 October, between 8.00 am and 6.00 pm.
- Q: I want to post my package but I am unsure if it will be received on time.
- A: We cannot guarantee your package will be received on time.

 A special delivery by Australia Post will be made to the
 Commission on Saturday 15 October. The very last day you should
 post your package in the metropolitan area is Thursday
 13 October. After this, take your package to the office of your local
 government. The packages will be placed in a sealed ballot box
 and counted after 6.00 pm on election day.
- Q: I have moved to a new address. What can I do to get a
- A: You vote at the local government you are enrolled in as at the close of rolls on 26 August 2011.
- Q: I have received a package for someone who used to live
- A: Return the package to the Western Australian Electoral Commission with the endorsement 'No longer lives here'. The Commission will follow it up.
- Q: Can I sign the ballot paper envelope on behalf of my wife, son or daughter, husband, or relative?
- A: No. Proxy voting is not permitted. You must sign your own declaration. Making a false declaration is an offence. There is no provision in the *Local Government Act* to allow another person to sign and complete the election package on their behalf even for those with power of attorney.
- Q: I do not want to sign the declaration on the ballot paper envelope.
- A: The *Local Government Act* requires that you sign the declaration. If you do not sign, your vote will not be counted.

Gift of films made available for borrowing

The Town gratefully acknowledges the gift of a series of films by award-winning director, Associate Professor Glen Stasiuk of Murdoch University, and has made the films available for borrowing at the Bassendean Memorial Library.

Associate Professor Stasiuk is a Minang-Wadjari Nyungar man with family living in this area.

Professor Stasiuk presented the Mayor, Cr John Gangell, with a copy of his seven short films as a gesture of appreciation for the Town in embracing cultural harmony and in working with the local Aboriginal community on their needs and aspirations.

The films were first screened at the NAIDOC Family Fun Day in July at Ashfield Reserve and are now accessible to the community as a part of the Library collection.

Included in the collection is *The Forgotten*, voted Best Documentary at the 2003 WA Screen Awards, which documents and examines the Aboriginal community's contribution to the Australian Armed Forces in the 20th century. Other film productions include: Noongar of the Beeliar (Swan River); The Ngallak Koort Boodja Project; Weewar—A Bindjareb Warrior; Footprints in the Sand; Gnulla Katitjin Quoppadar Boojar, and his latest film that is the basis of his PhD: Wadjemup: Black Prison – White Playground.

Ashfield Dynamo Soccer Club was the original name of the club some 40 years ago. In 2011 the Club changed its name from the Ashfield Soccer and Sports Club to the Ashfield Sports Club to reflect a desire to be a community facility for many sports, not just soccer. Although soccer is the main focus, the Club is happy to accommodate any sporting association/club willing to contribute in a positive manner to the community and the Club.

Ashfield Sports Club is located on the corner of Colstoun Road and Haig Street, Ashfield. The venue offers a large open area with wooden/carpeted floor, with tables available to seat up to 100 persons for a meal, with a maximum capacity for functions of up to 250 persons.

The main hall has an audiovisual system available and features a mural of the Ashfield area before development. There are both fixed and portable BBQs available, two pool tables, table tennis and dartboards. The facility is air-conditioned, with heating also available.

A fully functional kitchen with gas cooker/oven, fridge, freezer, electric deep fryer, bain-marie and microwave is available to hirers.

There are fully licensed bar facilities available, with a picturesque elevated balcony overlooking Ashfield Reserve. Outdoors there is a large covered grandstand with seating overlooking a grassed area large enough to host international football/rugby with floodlighting.

This facility can be used for all functions, fundraisers, dance groups, quiz nights, special interest groups, meetings and much more.

All waste must be out on the verge by 7.00 am on the Monday following your weekend set-out dates. To help us keep your street looking good, please place rubbish on your verge no earlier than the set-out dates indicated for your area.

Workshop on the location of the Children and Family Services 'One Stop Shop'

THE TOWN is looking to establish a 'One Stop Shop Children and Family Centre' and seeks community input to the site for the new Centre. The facility is likely to incorporate the Wind in the Willows Child Care Centre, Out of School Care, the Bassendean Child Health Centre, and other services all in one building.

To gather the information on the community's preferred location for the facility, two methods are being used: a paper-based survey and a community participation workshop. Survey forms have been circulated through schools, childcare centres, playgroups, the Bassendean Memorial Library and more. The survey closed on 23 September.

A workshop will be conducted on Wednesday 19 October from 7.00 pm (in the Committee Room, 48 Old Perth Road, Bassendean) to provide an overview of the survey results and an open forum to determine the preferred location with those in attendance.

The survey results and workshop outcome will be reported to Council to assist in the decision-making process.

Not just books!

The Bassendean Memorial Library has more than just books, DVDs and CDs for loan. There are a number of lifestyle improvement items that are also available. What about:

Securing your property?

Want to engrave those valuables around the house or in the shed?

The Library has engravers available for loan: bring your library ticket with you or join up when you come in. Easy and free! These engravers are simple to use—just plug in the unit and start writing with them. They work on most surfaces. The engraving unit comes with a useful sheet on property safety from the Office of Crime Prevention.

The Home Energy Audit Kit

The Power-Mate home energy audit kit is a conveniently packaged multi-purpose unit that will help you find out about your home's energy usage.

There is the Power-Mate energy meter, thermometers to check temperatures around the home, a shower timer (to keep you honest!) and a set of 'how to' cards which explain the best way to use and act on the information you gather. It's definitely worth having a look at ways to keep your energy consumption to a minimum in these times of increasing power costs! Again, simply borrow the unit with your library card.

Broadband kiosks: training available

The Library hosts two state-of-the-art desktop computers which have been supplied by the Federal Government. These computers are available for training seniors and the Library has a team of capable, knowledgeable and enthusiastic volunteers ready to assist you with an introduction to the world of the computer—or an in-depth examination of the Internet.

These sessions are run in the Library and are one-on-one—so no one is watching! Sessions run for an hour at a time and our volunteers try to be available at times best suited to you (between $9.00\,\mathrm{am} - 5.00\,\mathrm{pm}$). Just ring the Library on $9279\,2966$ to book a session.

There are 15 places available for the kite-making session on Saturday 8 October from 9.00 am to 12 noon.



On 12 July 2011 the President of the Bassendean Historical Society (Inc), Mr Paul Bridges, delivered the Annual Library Lecture.

Paul's talk was on the Bassendean Pensioner Guard Cottage at 1 Surrey Street. The lecture was accompanied by a display of uniforms and weapons from the Perth Volunteer Rifle and Artillery Regiment 1860.

The event was recorded, then edited and produced in a DVD format by local firm, Entity Media Productions. Copies of this excellent DVD are available for sale from the Bassendean Memorial Library or the Pensioner Guard Cottage (which is open on the last Sunday of each month).

This is a genuinely interesting, informative and rewarding insight into the history—and the place in history—of one of the earliest dwellings within the Town of Bassendean. The DVDs are priced at a cost recovery rate of \$10 each.
