
# **ANZAC Day Service**

## **Remembering Beatrice Chape**

Former Councillor and Freeman of the Town, Beatrice Chape, has died at the age of 97. Beatrice was the first woman elected as a Councillor at the Town, and served from 1973 to 1979. She was bestowed the status of Freeman of the Town in December 1996.

During her years on Council Beatrice was instrumental in the establishment of the Wind in the Willows Child Care Centre, the Senior Citizens' Welfare Association, Meals on Wheels, and the Hyde Retirement Village in James Street, amongst a host of other community services. Her contribution to the community and local government was immense.

Council's condolences have been extended to the Chape family.

# 2015 Local Planning Strategy Review

Back in May last year, Council adopted a *Strategic Planning Framework* (SPF) to establish and provide a greater strategic outlook and focus in respect to the planning and management of the Town's physical environment and setting.

This framework comprises 4 principal components (planning instruments) as follows:

- Local Planning Strategy
- Urban Intensification Plans
- Local Planning Scheme
- Design Guidelines and Local Planning Policies.

Following on in September 2016, Council adopted a 3 year (2016–2019) staged implementation plan to implement the framework. This included the appointment of a Director Strategic Planning (Mr Anthony Dowling who is now on board) to oversee and manage the implementation of the SPF. The first year of the plan (August 2016–September 2017) is focusing on reviewing and revising the Town's 2015 Local Planning Strategy. This is necessary because of changes to the State's planning framework. The State's draft Perth and Peel@3.5million planning framework sets out a strategy for accommodating within—and equitably across—the Perth Metropolitan Region (PMR) a forecast population of 3.5 million people by 2050. About 47% of this forecasted population is slated to be accommodated on redeveloped (infill) land. To this end, Bassendean has been targeted to provide an additional 4,200 new dwellings by 2050.

This will require the current 2015 Local Planning Strategy to be reviewed and revised in order to meet this target. This is likely to result in a combination of increasing residential densities within some of the Town's existing residential zones; and providing for mixed-use development (comprising a residential component) within neighbourhood centres and around the Town's train stations (known as transit-oriented development). In addition to the above—and recognising some of the key findings from the Town's recent 'Have Your Say' community consultation program that will inform a new Community Strategic Plan (in progress)—the current provision and distribution of public open space and community facilities throughout the Town will also be reviewed to ensure an equitable distribution of these. The current level of connectivity between neighbourhoods, to key activity areas, and to the Swan River, will also be examined to enable a highly connected and mobile community.

The review has commenced and will include engaging the Bassendean community in this process by both informing the community of progress and inviting input and feedback, etc. An engagement program is currently being prepared by the Town with consideration being given to utilising a highly interactive online digital community engagement platform for this. It is hoped to have this in place sometime in April 2017.

# Seventh councillor for the Town

Councillor numbers will increase from six to seven at the local government elections in October 2017.

The former Minister for Local Government approved the recommendation of the Local Government Advisory Board to increase the number of offices of Councillor at the Town from six to seven.

The Governor's Orders have not yet been issued, but administrative processes are in place to obtain the Governor's approval and gazette the change before October.

### Level 3 & 4 Home Care Packages

We have extended our Home Care Packages Program to include Levels 3 & 4. This means we now offer Home Care Packages Levels 1, 2, 3 & 4.

Again, this is great news for our loyal clients who may need higher level care; they no longer need to find another service provider when their needs change.

## Green Waste Collection 2017

### The 2017 Green Waste collection is scheduled to commence on the Monday following your specified weekend set-out date as shown in the verge collection map below.

To ensure your next green waste collection day is successful and collected in a safe manner please ensure the guidelines for green waste are strictly adhered to:

- Neatly place your green waste on the verge adjacent to your property on the specified weekend set-out dates listed for your collection area.
- Green waste will **not** be collected from the Town's Parks, Reserves or vacant lots—this is considered illegal dumping.
- Ensure that waste placed on verge complies with the green waste verge collection requirements provided in this notice.
- Please do not contaminate green waste with any other items such as garden mesh, wire or plastic materials—this cannot be collected as it cannot be recycled.
- If you engage a tree lopping or arborist company, please ensure you make them fully aware of the Town's specified weekend set-out dates and the green waste collection requirements provided in this notice. When obtaining quotes it is recommended that you receive written confirmation from the tree lopping or arborist company confirming that they will fully comply with the Town's green waste collection requirements provided in this notice.
- It is an offence to prune street verge trees and offenders will be prosecuted.
- Ranger inspections are being conducted to ensure that items are not placed out earlier than the specified set-out date for your collection area. Littering infringement may be imposed if green waste or other materials are placed out earlier than the specified set-out date and also for illegal dumping.
- Green waste collections will start at 7.00 am on the Monday following your specified weekend set-out date listed for your collection area.
  Please note that the contractor collecting the green waste will be video recording all area/s at the time of collection.



### Items that can be collected:

- Tree prunings (maximum length 1.5 m x 200 mm diameter)
- Palm fronds (maximum length 1.5 m x 200 mm diameter)
- Creepers
- Tree stumps (maximum length 1.5 m x 200 mm diameter)
- Tree leaves (boxed only)
- Succulents (boxed only)
- Bamboo
- Tree prunings with thorns
- Lawn clippings (boxed only)

### EMRC Commercial and Industrial Waste Sorting Facility

In November 2016, the Eastern Metropolitan Regional Council (EMRC) launched a new Commercial and Industrial Waste Sorting Facility at the Hazelmere Resource Recovery Park.

The Resource Recovery Park is designed to receive, store, process, repair and dismantle society's discarded materials, with the goal of diverting these from landfill and processing these into usable products.

The Commercial and Industrial Waste Sorting Facility recovers resources from commercial and industrial waste streams including timber, metal, cardboard and plastics. At full capacity the facility will process in the order of 50,000 tonnes of material per annum and divert around 25,000 tonnes of material from landfill. **Commercial and Industrial Waste** can be disposed of at the facility for a fee of \$145 (ex GST) per tonne.

Timber waste is also processed for recycling at Hazelmere Resource Recovery Park. Untreated wood waste (such as pallets, packaging and crates, off-cuts and cable reels) is processed into wood chip and wood chips fines and sold as usable products. Wood waste disposal charges are subject to the grade and contamination and can be found online at www.emrc.org.au/fees-charges.html

Over the next five years the site will be further developed with a number of planned facilities designed to receive, process, separate and repair discarded materials.

Residents can choose and collect their seedlings using their voucher from the Men of the Trees nursery on **Saturday 24 June 2017, 8am–3pm** at Lot 2, Stirling Crescent (corner Amherst Road), Hazelmere.

Stocks are limited and your voucher must be presented on the day of pick up. No plants will be issued if you do not have a voucher.



The Plants to Residents Scheme is only available to the Town's residents and ratepayers.
