## Your vote is crucial!

Make sure you vote in the Local Government Elections—Saturday 21 October.

Local government ordinary elections are held every two years, on the third Saturday in October.

The next Town of Bassendean election is scheduled for Saturday, 21 October 2017. Councillors are elected for four-year terms, with half of the Councillors' terms concluding at each ordinary election.

The Town's elections are conducted as postal elections by the Western Australian Electoral Commission.

## From October 2017, the total number of Councillors serving on Council will be 7.

There will be four vacancies at the elections to be held in October. Councillor Mike Lewis, Councillor Gerry Pule and Councillor Paul Bridges' terms expire at the elections in October, while Councillor John Gangell, Councillor Bob Brown and Councillor Renee McLennan's terms expire in October 2019.

There are no wards within the Town—all Councillors elected represent the whole of the district.

#### Voter information

If you live in or are an owner or occupier of rateable property within the Town of Bassendean, and you meet the voter eligibility criteria and enrolled to vote by 1 September, you are entitled to vote in the local government elections.

#### How to vote

Voting packages are mailed to all eligible electors about three weeks prior to election day.

The package will include a list of candidates, ballot papers, instructions on how to vote and a declaration.

To vote, follow the instructions included in the package.

There is no in-person voting.



Completed voting papers should be returned by post as per the instructions included in the voting package. If you do not think that your postal voting package can be returned by post in time, you can deliver it by hand to a polling official:

- Prior to election day, at the Town's Customer Service Centre, 35 Old Perth Road, Bassendean; or
- On polling day, to the Town's polling centre located at the Bassendean Seniors' & Community Centre, 50 Old Perth Road, Bassendean.

## Ryde Program expansion

The Town of Bassendean recognised that young people without access to suitable supervisors or vehicles, were severely marginalised from participating in employment, training and leisure activities.

In response, the Town's Youth Service, Volunteer Centre, Library and with support from Swan Valley Rotary and Lotterywest, partnered to develop a pilot program seeking to address this need.

The RYDE (Regional Youth Driver Education) Program model sought to pilot a 'proof of concept' to demonstrate that a consortium of community agencies could use technology to manage each partner's participation, and automate most of the human elements required for it to run smoothly.

The Program has been under constant development since practical operations commenced in February 2016, and now offers supervised driving hours to over 100 young people within the region.

Recently, the City of Cockburn signed up to be the RYDE Program's first large scale expansion site, based out of Cockburn Youth Centre. Staff from Bassendean Youth Services and Cockburn Youth Services have worked closely in recent months to get all the pieces in place to launch operations by the end of 2017.

South West Young Driver Development Program based in Bunbury have also commenced the planning phase to start in early 2018.

## **Bulk Rubbish Collection 2017**

The 2017 Bulk Rubbish collection is scheduled to commence on the Monday following your area's specified weekend set-out date shown on the verge collection map on the right.

To ensure your next bulk rubbish collection is successful and collected in a safe manner, please:

- **Do not** place your bulk rubbish on the verge earlier than your area weekend set-out dates to avoid a littering infringement.
- **Do not** place any additional items on your verge from Monday on your corresponding area collection dates.
- **Do not** exceed the allowable two (2) cubic metres waste limit.
- Place bulk rubbish neatly on the verge so that it does not obstruct the line of sight of pedestrians, cyclists or motorists.
- Ensure your bulk rubbish pile/s are clear from power poles, street signs, utility boxes, water meters and sprinkler systems as these may be damaged during the collection process.
- **Do not** obstruct footpaths or your normal kerbside bin service.
- Contain or protect spiked or sharp items to avoid injury to waste removal workers. Small items must be boxed or bagged.

#### Please note:

- No returns will be made to a street for bulk rubbish put out late
- Non-compliant items and/or excessive waste not collected must be removed from the verge within seven (7) days or an infringement will be issued.

Do not place bulk rubbish onto any of the Town's parks, reserves or any other vacant lot including privately-owned vacant lots or other residents' verges.

#### Items collected

- Household furniture.
- Whitegoods\*/Metal products: stoves, washing machines, air conditioners.
- **Timber products**: maximum size 1500mm x 900mm x 700mm. Place separately from other items.
- **General junk**: maximum size 1500mm x 900mm x 700mm.
- \*Excludes fridges and freezers. The Town provides a free fridge/freezer collection service. Please call 9350 7195 to arrange.

## Tip passes

You can utilise your Town of Bassendean Tip Passes to dispose bulk rubbish at the Red Hill Waste Management Facility if your set-out date is not convenient for you.

- **No** part of a motor vehicle (except car seats)
- No asbestos or material resembling
- No Household Hazardous Waste\*
- No gas cylinders\*

- \*Household Hazardous Waste: There are a number of permanent drop off facilities throughout Perth for residents to safely dispose of hazardous items which must not go into your green-top rubbish bin. It is free to take a combined total 20kg/20L of items to Red Hill Waste Management Facility (9574 6235).
- \*\*Mattresses: Hazelmere Resource Recovery Park (92747807) and Red Hill Waste Management Facility (95746235) accept mattresses. Fees apply.



## Get your **free** reusable shopping bags!

**IN JUNE**, Council advised that it was supporting a state-wide ban on single-use plastic shopping bags being available in large supermarkets by producing 1000 reusable shopping bags as part of the campaign to encourage the community to also get behind the 'Ban the bag' campaign. Since then, the State Government has announced that a ban on these bags will commence on 1 July 2018.

To assist you to go plastic bag free, call in to the Customer Service Centre at 35 Old Perth Road, or the Bassendean Memorial Library at 46 Old Perth Road, and collect your two, free, reusable, calico shopping bags—plus some information on recycling and caring for the environment—and do your bit for the planet.

## Children's Week Walk and Market



Notice to all land owners and occupiers Fire Break Notice

Bushfires Act 1954

The Town undertakes annual fire inspections to ensure all properties comply with the Bush Fires Act 1954 and the Council's Fire Management Practices.

Prior to 31 October 2017, properties of all sizes within the Town of Bassendean shall be cleared of combustible material from the whole of the land. All combustible material is to be slashed or mowed to ensure that it is no longer than 5cm in height from 31 October 2017 until 31 March 2018.

Living trees, shrubs, plants under cultivation and maintained lawns are excluded from the clearing requirements.

Any variations in the standard of firebreaks are to be the subject of a specific request to the Town's authorised Firebreak Inspector and any such variation shall be for one year only.

The penalty for failing to comply with the Bush Fires Act is a modified penalty of \$250 or a fine of up to \$5000 by the court. The owner of the property in default is liable, whether prosecuted or not, to pay the cost of performing the work directed by the required date.

Please note that the Town of Bassendean's Local Laws prohibit the burning of foliage or bush without the Town's prior consent. If you wish to make enquiries concerning this, please contact the Council's Ranger Service on 9377 7480 for an evaluation of your land.
