

Planning for playtime at **Sandy Beach Reserve**

Following lots of creative input from our community, an impressive concept design for the nature-based play space planned for Sandy Beach Reserve has been prepared for our community to consider.

The nature-based play space is designed to be an attractive, all-abilities recreation facility, that will provide a diverse range of outdoor play opportunities for varying ages and abilities. The play space is proposed to sit upon an island created above the level of the flood plain, and nestled within the grove of existing mature trees. Focal points of the play space include the towering tree house and the 30 metre long flying fox. It is also planned that kids will have places to build cubbies, be challenged and given the opportunity to safely explore in the nature play environment.

Dog owners are assured that the Reserve will continue to be a space where people can recreate with their dogs.

Town to tackle weeds!

Weeds have been a hot topic of conversation in the Town.

There has been much discussion around how we can best manage weeds while also being conscious of the need to protect the health of our residents, the river and our fragile ecosystems.

Council has committed to taking a precautionary approach and using non-chemical management of weeds that emerge from road kerb lines, road islands and footpaths within the Town. While a suitable solution was being sourced, little weed management has occurred so you may have noticed more weeds than normal around the Town lately. However, our streets will soon be weed free again after the Town of Bassendean recently awarded Natural Area Holdings the contract to steam weed our streets.

Commencing in February 2018, the contractor will undertake their first steam weed eradication program to all streets where weeds have emerged from road kerb lines, road islands and footpaths.

In line with the Town of Bassendean's road hierarchy, and in order of priority, the management of weeds for 'Local Distributor' roads will be undertaken approximately 5 times per year and 'Local Access' roads approximately 3 times per year.

In addition, the Town has also undertaken trials in some of the Town's reserves using non-chemical weed eradication techniques to identify the effects on weeds.

Plants to Residents

The Town of Bassendean is offering residents a maximum of 30 native plant seedlings per household at a subsidised cost of \$1 each. Perhaps this is the perfect opportunity to consider transforming your verge into a waterwise, native garden!

To take advantage of the opportunity to showcase some of Western Australia's unique flora in your garden, simply bring your rates notice, or a document which provides proof of residency within the Town, to the Customer Service Centre, 35 Old Perth Road, Bassendean, between 9 am to 4 pm, Tuesday 6 March till Friday 16 March 2018 (unless sold out prior). Once you have provided proof of residency, you will be given the


opportunity to purchase a voucher for up to 30 seedlings. You can choose and collect your seedlings using your voucher at the Men of the Trees nursery on Saturday 23 June 2018 between 8 am and 2 pm. The Men of the Trees nursery is at Lot 2 Stirling Crescent (cnr Amherst Road), Hazelmere.

Stocks are limited and your voucher must be presented on the day of pick-up—no plants will be issued if you do not have a voucher.

The timing of this scheme allows the seedlings sufficient time to become established over the wettest months of the year. Being local native plants, the seedlings are already well adapted to our climate and, once established, should not require a high level of watering.

The Scheme is only available to the Town's residents and ratepayers.

Town achieves target in reducing carbon emissions

In 2015, the Town committed to a Carbon Reduction Target to reduce its corporate carbon emissions of 7.5% by 2016/2017 from the baseline 2011/2012 financial year. The Town is proud to announce that its corporate carbon emissions has reduced by 7.6% a year early!

The Town tracks its carbon emissions, which are emitted via the use of electricity, gas and other fuels, through an online platform. This platform also keeps track of the Town's energy and water consumption for all Council assets, as well as energy efficiency projects that are implemented.

Some projects that the Town completed to achieve its target include solar lighting in selected parks and reserves, LED lighting retrofits in several administration, community buildings and in street lighting along Old Perth Road, and installation of solar photovoltaic (PV) systems on high energy consuming buildings.

These projects were just the beginning of the Town's emissions reduction and, since late 2016, solar PV systems have continued to pop up on the Town's buildings and facilities. The latest installations can be seen at Ashfield Community Centre, Wind in the Willows Childcare Centre, Hyde Retirement Village and Alf Faulkner Hall.

The Town today has over 110 kW of solar PV systems installed on buildings and facilities and, in the 2016/2017 financial year alone, reduced its corporate emissions by a further 8.2%!

The Town wants to continue its commitment to reducing emissions to combat climate change and reduce energy costs. Council has supported the formation of a new Sustainability Committee, reflecting the importance that is placed on being responsible stewards of our environment. The committee will work with Council and our community to introduce further initiatives to assist the Town to reduce our carbon footprint.

A new Emissions Reduction Plan is currently under development and will be out for public consultation later this year on the 'Your Say' community portal. The plan will include a new target for the Town to achieve and new actions to implement.

Enhanced play space at Wind in the Willows Bassendean

Children's Services has been working hard to enhance the outdoor environments for some of the youngest children at Wind in the Willows; the Nursery now boasts a beautiful garden for children to explore.

The new play space includes a tree, which will provide a 10 metre canopy of natural shade over time. This is surrounded by a beautiful octagonal wooden deck for children to negotiate and socialise. Children enjoy the texture of the soft white sand as they dig and cook in the sandpit, and the aroma of jasmine fills the air as they clamber over logs and stepping stones. The artificial turf is both functional and beautiful and the meandering pathways provide opportunity for physical development as children navigate their trollies and collect their treasures.

The feedback from families has been very positive, and we in Children's Services are thankful to be able to provide greater opportunities for connectedness to nature to support early childhood development.

Local family honoured with naming of laneway

THE TOWN is proud to announce the naming of McKinlay Lane in honour of Mary McKinlay MBE, and her husband, James McKinlay OBE, MM and ED. Mary and James McKinlay lived in and contributed greatly to the Bassendean community and to the wider Western Australian community over many years.

Mrs Mary McKinlay (née Lumsden) was well-loved, being known for her understanding nature, and for providing help wherever possible. She was a founding member of the Bassendean RSL Sub Branch Ladies Auxiliary and State President of the RSL Ladies Auxiliary for fifteen years. She served on the Board of the Soldiers' Dependents' Scholarship Trust, and the Claremont Hospital Visitors' Board, and was awarded the MBE in 1948 for her work during the war years.

Mr James McKinlay was born in 1894; he won the Annual Guildford Swim Through race in 1910, and was known for his humour, fairness and humility. He served in the Australian Army Signals Corps from 1914 till 1964; he served in Gallipoli and the Western Front in WWI, and again in WWII in the SW-Pacific Campaign, and was highly decorated.

Their descendants still live in Bassendean today, and are pictured having their first look at the new street sign for McKinlay Lane.
