POINT RESERVE JETTIES

Late last year, an inspection of the jetties at Point Reserve revealed that their structural integrity had been compromised by termite damage. The jetties were subsequently closed to address the immediate safety hazard. Council has since committed to the reinstatement of the jetties and allocated funds for the structural assessment of both the north and south jetties and to fund the design work required to replace the north jetty. The Town will apply for grants to help fund that replacement process.

FORMER SITE EDEN HILL SHOPPING CENTRE

The private owners of the former shopping centre site on the corner of Morley Drive and Ivanhoe Street in Eden Hill have approached Council with an offer to purchase the adjacent Townowned corner lot with the intention to redevelop the amalgamated site as a local shopping and housing precinct. If the Town-owned lot is sold as proposed, the private owners can prepare and submit plans for the development. Western Power will provide a community briefing about opportunities for underground power in parts of Eden Hill and Bassendean north of the train line.

Graham Downe, Underground Power Projects Manager, will discuss Western Power's need to replace ageing infrastructure on the Eden Hill side of the railway line.

Western Australia's electrical network was originally constructed as overhead powerlines and much of Perth's urban areas remained overhead until 1991 when the State Government required all new urban subdivisions to be underground.

Typically, a project will take about 12 to 18 months from the start of construction to project completion, however timing can vary depending on size and complexity of a project area. Visit https://www.yoursay.bassendean.wa.gov.au/


- Fewer power outages and more reliable electricity



We've sorted a better bin system

THE TOWN OF BASSENDEAN WILL BE INTRODUCING A THREE-BIN SYSTEM BY 1 JULY 2020.

Why do we need a third bin?

Under the WA Waste Strategy, all Councils need to introduce a three-bin FOGO system by 2025. About 55% of rubbish in our existing bins is organic food and garden waste. We can separate this waste, divert it from landfill and use it to create mulch and compost as part of a circular economy.

The three bins - yellow lid for recycling, a new lime-green lid for FOGO (Food Organics and Garden Organics), and a red lid bin for general waste will give you more options for sorting your waste at home, so you can do your bit to help the environment and save us all money.

Overall, the three bin system will provide your household with increased bin capacity.





Place bins out by 6am on your collection day



Maximum weight of each bin is 70kg



Do not park in front of bins and keep laneways clear





FOGO









What goes in your FOGO bin?

LIME GREEN - 240 LITRE FOGO BIN, EMPTIED WEEKLY

Every FOGO bin comes with a free kitchen caddy and a supply of compostable liners. Place all your food scraps, coffee grounds and paper towels in the kitchen caddy. Empty your kitchen caddy into your green lid FOGO bin and add your garden waste.















What goes in your Recycling bin?

YELLOW - 240 LITRE RECYCLING BIN, EMPTIED FORTNIGHTLY

Continue placing recyclable materials such as paper, cardboard, aluminium and steel cans, glass and plastic containers in your yellow lid bin.



What goes in your General Waste bin?

RED - 140 LITRE GENERAL WASTE BIN, EMPTIED FORTNIGHTLY

Place all general waste items that cannot be composted or recycled, such as pappies, plastic bags and bygiene products.

WHAT HAPPENS TO FOGO MATERIAL?

All food organics and garden organics collected in the Town of Bassendean will be sent to a new Mobile Aeration Floor Facility at the Red Hill Waste Management Facility for processing into compost.


FOGO material is arranged in rows. Air is fed under the rows to aerate the FOGO material and composting takes place. The end products are further refined to enhance the compost, ready for use throughout Perth's Eastern Region to enrich our depleted soils.

Local governments may also be end users of products such as composts and fertilisers for maintaining community parks, gardens and sporting grounds.

To produce good quality compost, we need to minimise the contamination in our FOGO bins by separating them well in your home. By sorting our waste correctly we also reduce processing costs which saves our ratepayers money.

Separating your waste correctly at home will allow us to recycle and recover more of the material you throw away. This means that as a community we send less of our waste to landfill. By sorting your waste, we can improve recycling and contribute to the State Government's target diverting 70% of our waste from landfill by 2025.

We all need to take responsibility for sorting our waste and learning what needs to go in each bin. This is important because careful sorting prevents contamination of FOGO material. If in doubt, leave it out and contact the Town of Bassendean for advice.

Meet the locals

THERESIA SKAGERFALT FROM SWEDEN

Born in Sweden, raised in Africa, Theresia Skagerfalt became an Aussie in January 2020 at the Town of Bassendean citizenship ceremony.

"It started on a warm evening in a crowded bar in Rhodes, Greece when a long haired, world-travelling, frisbee-throwing Australian chucked a drink coaster on my table," she recalled. "Having just worked in a five-star London hotel, my first thought was "who does he think he is?" Well, something clicked and the adventure took us to Italy for a season in the snow and then to "get a proper job. Seven years later and a whole lot of experiences richer, we turned our sights on setting down some roots in his hometown of Perth."

The couple now live in Bassendean with their five-year old son. Theresia has started her own company, making traditional Swedish gnomes from specially selected recycled jumpers. Some local residents offer her jumpers to re-use.

PATRICK GONG FROM CHINA

When Patrick Gong and his mother moved from China to Australia 10 years ago, little did he know he would become a chess champion and travel the world.

"When I started at primary school here, my mum said it would be nice to make some new friends so I joined the chess club," he said.

He is now a chess master, ranked second in WA and he has travelled to Denmark, Russia, Mongolia and Singapore, among other places. He is also a third year biochemistry student at the University of Western Australia.

His mother Shirley Sun, a Chinese language teacher, moved her young son to Perth and ultimately Bassendean, seeking better opportunities. And at only 20, he has certainly found some great opportunities already.

FROM NEW ZEALAND

A remedial massage therapist at The Wellness Place in Bassendean for more than seven years, Louise McCartin jokes that she might have to lose her Kiwi accent when she becomes a citizen.

Although she has lived in Australia for 30 years as a permanent resident and bought a house in Eden Hill 17 years ago, it was only when she fell off her bicycle and fractured her arm two years ago that she finally found time to apply for citizenship.

Louise originally left Christchurch, New Zealand to work in Sydney, and after visiting Kiwi friends in Cottesloe she asked for a transfer to WA.

"I loved the really blue skies and the chilled and friendly lifestyle here. I garden and I ride my bike and there is a really lovely and connected feel about this community," she said.

NICOLAS ONI FROM THE IVORY COAST

Nicolas Oni, a former accountant born on the Ivory Coast, was travelling from France to Tahiti with a friend who had a friend in Australia – so he made Australia his home in 2011.

Now with two children and living in Ashfield, he works for Australia Post near the airport in freight handling.

"I could say I want to impress my French friends with my Australian passport, but I am really becoming a citizen because I feel it's the right thing to do, to fit in here and feel part of the country," he said.






